



1	Pariksha Pe Charcha 2023	<p>6th edition of Pariksha Pe Charcha 2023 was conducted on 27th January, 2023. During the programme, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India interacted with students, teachers and parents in a town-hall interactive format and gave them his valuable suggestions/ inputs on overcoming examination stress. He also witnessed the exhibits of students showcased at the venue before the interaction.</p> <p>This year PPC received unprecedented response with about 38.80 Lakh registrations out of which more than 16 lakhs are from State Boards. The registrations have been received from 155 countries.</p> <p>During the programme, HPM responded to wide ranging questions primarily from students including on handling disappointment; on preparation for exams and time management; on unfair means in exams and taking shortcuts; on working hard vs working smart; on recognising one's potential; on handling criticism; on gaming and online addiction; on stress after exams; on benefits of learning new languages; on the role of teachers in motivating students; on the behaviour of students etc.</p> <p>HPM also urged parents, teachers and guardians to dilute the stressful environment that is being created during exams to the maximum extent.</p>
