

Each qualification in New Zealand has different entry requirements. One of those requirements considers your previous qualifications against the qualification you are applying for. There are additional entry requirements for some qualifications offered at some New Zealand institutions. These entry requirements are separate and additional to the English language entry requirements.

As a general rule, for those wishing to complete a postgraduate qualification with an IELTS score of 6.5 and no band less than 6.0 is the minimum required. However, each institution sets their own English language requirements, and these may be different depending on the study programme that you are interested in. We strongly recommend you contact your preferred institution to find out what the English language requirement for your chosen study programme is. ### Glossary

<u>Citizen:</u> A person who is a member of a country and who has rights because of being born there or because of being given rights.

<u>Permanent resident:</u> A Permanent Resident is a resident of a particular country, who usually holds a permanent resident visa. Holding a permanent visa can provide them with the same rights as citizens of that same country.
