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## **Director's Overview**



I am delighted to share with you the 2019 Annual Report for Indian Institute of Management Lucknow. This vear we reinforced our commitment to invest in the core programs and activities of the institute. incentivise faculty research and to pursue accreditations and international linkages that will build IIM Lucknow as a truly global school. The task is not over yet, but I am happy to state that with the support of all stakeholders, we are moving in the right direction.

This would not have been possible without the contributions of our dedicated faculty members, students and distinguished alumni. I would also like to thank our Chairman, Board of Governors, Shri N. Chandrasekaran and all members of the board for actively taking an interest in various initiatives and guiding us.

The details of our various activities during the year are provided in the respective sections of the annual report.

#### Programmes

Post the enactment of IIM Act, the Indian Institute of Management Lucknow is now empowered to confer degrees. Thus, the institution conferred PhD and MBA degrees in the 2020 convocation. This year, a total of 659 candidates were awarded degrees and diplomas by the Institute. The batch size of our International Programme in Management for Executives increased to 101 from 60.

This year was a good one for the institute's global presence, with IIM Lucknow adding three new academic partners globally to its existing pool of international academic partners: Johns Hopkins University USA (Department of International Health, Bloomberg School of Public Health), Friedrich-Alexander-Universitat Erlangen-Nurnberg (FAU) School of Business, Economics & Society Nuremberg Germany and MSUOM Nepal. This year, 83 students of IIM Lucknow visited our partner institutions and 28 students from our partner institutions visited us.

Our student body made incredible efforts to showcase excellence in all fields globally. A team comprising Anabil Dey, Nayonika Saha and Avik Debnath from MBA Batch of 2020 represented IIM Lucknow at the National Grand Finale of HUL L.I.M.E Season XI in collaboration with CNBC TV 18. The team secured the 4th spot among 23,697 teams across India.

Sanjeet Kumar Sameer (an EFPM student) received the Best Paper award for his paper (co-authored by Prof. Pushpendra Priyadarshi) titled 'Relationship between Autonomy, Job Crafting, Person - Job fit and Internal Employability: A Study on Indian Public Sector Energy Companies' presented in the two-day international conference on the theme "Empowering Women: Fostering Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Sustainability". This international conference was jointly organized by NITI Aayog, Govt. of India and Shri Ram College of Commerce (SRCC), New Delhi and had participation of scholars / practitioners from various countries including Canada, USA, Australia, Bangladesh.

Our FPM students Soumya Vaithinathan, Shuvabrata Chakraborty and Ankit Sharma won the best paper awards in the Society of Operations Management (SOM) 2019 conference at IIT Kanpur. IIM Lucknow won three out of overall nine awards across three categories.

Our student team also won the Best Debating team trophy at the FMS State of the Union Debate held at Vigyan Bhawan, Delhi, beating teams from IIM Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Calcutta and FMS Delhi.

This year, our students showed their excellence not only in academics, but also in the arena of sports. IIM Lucknow Powerlifting Team represented India at an international level Powerlifting Competition, and made their presence felt with an impressive haul of half-a-dozen medals.

Our students Mr. Abhishek Gupta and Mr. Devendra Mahajan were awarded IDFC First Bank Scholarship for MBA students for the year 2019-2021. This was the first time that students of IIM Lucknow received this scholarship. Our students Ms. Aastha Agarwal, Ms. Nikita Agarwal and Mr. Sauhard Gupta won the prestigious Aditya Birla Scholarship for the year 2019. Our student Salapu Sai Ashok won the prestigious OPJEMS scholarship for the year 2019.

On the alumni front, IIM Lucknow organised Samvaad 2019 on the theme "Changing Business Paradigms: Disrupt or be Disrupted" where 23 CXOs and senior level alumni participated and shared insights with current students.

#### **Accreditation and Rankings**

This year, too, IIM Lucknow retained the 4th place amongst all management schools in the prestigious NIRF 2019. In another landmark achievement this year, the institute earned the prestigious AACSB International Accreditation. The accreditation is earned by only 5% of the world's business schools. The institute is now AMBA and AACSB accredited and it strengthens our programs and benchmarks them globally

#### **Faculty Research and Consultancy**

This year, the Institute strengthened its faculty strength to 93 from 83 in the previous academic year. The faculty is the intellectual resource of the institute and it saw 91 papers in peer reviewed journals, 15 book publications and 3 case studies. Besides this, the faculty also presented 72 papers in national and international conferences.

One of the notable faculty publication this year was in "Energy Economics". The paper was authored by Prof. Kaushik Bandhopadhyay, Prof Sanjay Singh and Ms. Monika Gupta on "Measuring effectiveness of carbon tax on Indian road passenger transport- A system dynamics approach". The paper examined whether carbon tax as a mitigation instrument could be effective in reducing CO2 emissions from road passenger transport in India. Applying a simulation exercise with system dynamics modelling using different tax rates, the paper suggested a potential reduction in CO2 emissions in the range of 26 to 40% as compared to a baseline scenario in 2050. The analysis is an important one for policymakers in designing an appropriate rate of the carbon tax and optimise its effect through revenue recycling. Another good paper was published in Tourism Management by Prof. Satya Bhushan Das et al on "All that glitters is not green- Creating trustworthy eco-friendly services at green hotels". The paper highlights the issue of "greenwashing" or unsubstantiated claims about good environmental policies. The paper proposes a potential green service encounter (GSE) framework by which hotel management can reassure customers and secure long-term patronage.

The quality of faculty publications this year was substantially rich. Though it won't be possible to write about all the papers but a few other notable journals where faculty research was published were: International Journal of Forecasting (Prof. Karmakar on "Intraday portfolio risk management"), International Journal of Production Research (Prof Sushil Kumar, Prof Indranil Biswas and Mr. Rohit Gupta on "Pricing decisions for three-echelon supply chain with advertising and quality effort-dependent fuzzy demand"), Annals of Operation Research (Prof. Suresh Jakhar and Mr. Manjot Singh on "Appropriate location for remanufacturing plant towards sustainable supply chain"), Studies in Higher Education (Prof Nishant Uppal on "What are you rating? Moderation effects of teachers tiredness and students agreeableness"), Applied Economics (Prof Madhumita Chakraborty and Mr Vaibhav Lalwani on "Aggregate earnings and gross domestic product-International evidence"), Information System Frontiers (Prof Pradeep Kumar and Prof Bharat Bhasker on "DPRel- A Meta-Path Based Relevance Measure for Mining Heterogeneous Networks"), Journal of Futures

Market (Prof Alok Dixit and Prof Vipul on "Options pricing and short-selling in the underlying- Evidence from India" Information System Frontiers (Prof Arunabha Mukhopadhyay on "A Markov-based Model for Information Security Risk Assessment in Healthcare MANETs") and Economic Modelling (Prof Debdatta Pal on "Correlation dynamics of crude oil with agricultural commodities- A comparison between energy and food crops").

Apart from though leadership and research, the faculty also undertook 23 consulting and policy intervention projects with public sector organisations, private sector organisations, Central and State Governments and The World Bank Group. Supported by World Bank Group, Prof Samir Srivastava and Prof Amit Agrahari did a well-received consulting project on Government of India's e-procurement intervention and its impact on procurement performance using data analytics. In addition to this Six externally funded research projects were also undertaken by the faculty.

The faculty members also provided leadership and capacity building support to other academic institutions. Prof Ajay Kumar Garg was appointed as a Member of Board, Indian Institute of Management Sirmaur, Prof Venkatramanaiah was appointed as Executive Council member of Jawaharlal Nehru Technology University, Andhra Pradesh, Prof Neeraja Pandey was appointed as Member –Board of Studies of SVKM's NMIMS School of Entrepreneurship and Family business management, Prof Anadi Pande is an AICTE representative on the Board of Governors of Fortune Institute of International Business and is also nominated as a member of Expert Empowered Committee, MHRD, to assess Institute of Eminence status.

Apart from this, Prof Ashwini Kumar served as an Independent Director in U.P Electronics Corporation Limited and Prof Prakash Singh serves as an Independent Director on the board of Need Livelihood and Microfinance Private Limited, a RBI registered NBFC. Prof Vikas Srivastava was appointed Chairman of the Merger Committee, constituted by Government of Uttar Pradesh to prepare a road map and implementation plan for the Merger of Cooperative Banks in the state.

# Public Policy Interventions: Visioning Exercise For Up Government (Manthan) and its Impact

In order to support the Uttar Pradesh Government in its vision of one trillion USD state

economy (GSDP) and to prioritize government activities, IIM Lucknow conducted a specially designed three--day brainstorming workshop for the council of ministers and top administrative officers of all departments of the Uttar Pradesh government. This was attended by the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh. This programme highlights our continued commitment towards public policy interventions.

The workshop involved a multi subject area training required for envisioning; facilitating exchange of ideas from policymakers; collecting their agreed goals for the state along with informing them of the micro and macro concrete outcomes. There were faculty members from across all academic areas involved in this workshop, led by the Director, Prof. Archana Shukla.

At the end of the workshop, participants collectively agreed on six priority areas for the state: (i) improvement of the basic infrastructure to support economic activities; (ii) enhancement of industrial development through enhanced ease of doing business and strengthening MSMEs; (iii) sustainable approach to agriculture and allied activities; (iv) higher focus on human development indicators, particularly health and education; (v) improvement of law and order in the state for holistic development; and (vi) urban development.

IIM Lucknow also signed a MoU with the State Government of Uttar Pradesh to provide managerial support for the CM Youth Programme. The institute also finalised the adoption of five gram panchayats under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan of Govt. of India.

#### **Centres of Excellence And IIM Lucknow Incubators**

IIM Lucknow has four active centres of excellence that carry out niche action based research. These are Centre for Food and Agri Business Management, Centre for Marketing in Emerging Economies, Centre for Leadership and Human Values and Centre for Business Sustainability.

IIM Lucknow Enterprise Incubation Centre, supported by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India and UP State Government, conducted regular Pitch days and successfully incubated four start-ups this year. SIDBI Centre for Incubations and Financial Inclusion nurtures start-ups working on financial inclusion aided by technology and has signed MOUs with Yes Bank. Centre for Marketing in Emerging Economies conducted a path breaking research project to study Indian voter behaviour through sentiment analysis.

#### **Executive Education**

IIM Lucknow conducted 148 long and short duration executive programs in 2019-2020. 4223 participants attended the program from Government, Public Sector and Private sector. This year saw 14 blended executive education programmes. A total of 148 executive education programmes were conducted.

#### **Institute and Other National Events**

Led by a strong administrative team and employee welfare committee, IIM Lucknow organised the 35th foundation day with a tree plantation drive on July 27, 2020. More than 200 trees with medicinal properties were planted. The institute also conducted trainings on Right to Information, International Yoga Day, Hindi Pakhwara, Vigilance Awareness Week, Constitution Day and Swachhata Pakhwada.

This year also saw the presentation of the Lakshmipat Singhania – IIM Lucknow National Leadership Awards 2018 by The President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind. The awardees were Ms. Kiran Mazumdar Shaw, Chairperson and Managing Director, Biocon Limited; Dr. Srikumar Banerjee, Homi Bhabha Chair Professor, Bhabha Atomic Research Centre and Chancellor; Dr. Bhushan Punani, Executive Secretary, Blind People's Association (India); Shri Puneet Dalmia, Managing Director, Dalmia Bharat Group; Dr. Amit Sharma Group Leader, Structural and Computational Biology Group, International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology; and Shri Anshu Gupta, Founder Director, Goonj.

# Rankings and Global Accreditation

Indian Institute of Management Lucknow retained the 4<sup>th</sup> place amongst all management schools in the prestigious NIRF 2019 rankings. This year IIM Lucknow has significantly improved its scores compared to last year in all the criteria. The overall rank is based on, teaching learning and resources, research and professional practice, graduation outcomes, outreach and inclusivity and peer perception.

Indian Institute of Management Lucknow earned the prestigious AACSB International Accreditation (earned by only 5% of the world's business schools). AACSB accreditation provides a framework of 15 international standards against which business schools around the world assess the quality of their educational services. These standards ensure continuous improvement and provide focus for schools to deliver on their mission, innovate, and drive impact. AACSB-accredited schools have successfully undergone a rigorous review process conducted by their peers in the business education community, ensuring that they have the resources, credentials, and commitment needed to provide students with a first-rate, future-focused business education. # Ol Post Graduate Programme in Management (PGPM)



The Post Graduate Programme is designed to develop professional managers with strong conceptual fundamentals and skills required to manage businesses of the future, while giving them the vision to determine what the future will be. This programme is a two year, full time, residential programme. The students meeting the programme requirements are awarded the degree – Masters in Business Administration. The PGP continually challenges the students to be prepared for the future. Courses are redesigned every year with feedback from the industry. New courses are introduced at an impressive rate each year. This helps in incorporating the latest concepts and paradigms into the curriculum even as the world is awakening to the need. The PGP also prepares the students to take up multiple responsibilities and energizes them for the fast-track performance expected of them. The curriculum, by any standards, is rigorous. Assignments, live and simulated projects, periodic evaluations and demanding academic schedules ensure that the students develop time management skills. It is this quality which makes managers from IIM Lucknow a cut above the rest in challenging situations.

#### **Preparatory Programme**

The preparatory programme is meant for a new batch of the students who are found relatively under-prepared in Quantitative skills. Preparatory programme was held before the start of the regular session, 118 students attended this programme during June 11-22, 2019.

#### Field Visits of PGP ABM Students

The Post Graduate Programme in Agri-business Management (PGP-ABM) of Indian Institute of Management Lucknow has unique features to enhance practical learning through rigorous field exposure. Under its field visit programme, ABM students spend a week's time with the rural community to learn the business environment of the rural economy. The exercise is divided into two modules, i.e., village study and a thematic study. In the first module, the students are required to study the village economy and resources through participatory research techniques and in the second module; they undertake a pre- designed research study on agribusiness and rural marketing issues.

# 03 Financial Assistance, Industry Scholarships and Awards



#### **Financial Assistance**

The Institute's Financial Assistance Scheme, started in 1993-94, provides financial support for needy students on the basis of annual family income and academic performance. Under this scheme, in the year 2019-2020, 12 scholarships were awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> year students and 50 scholarships were awarded to the 2<sup>nd</sup> year students.

In addition, students are free to avail Central Government scholarships (through National Scholarship Portal) and State Government scholarships based on the eligibility criteria and rules and regulations of the respective departments.

# 04 Post Graduate Programme in Sustainable Management (PGP-SM)



Post Graduate Programme in Sustainable Management (PGPSM) is a two year full time, residential programme. It is designed to help managers develop an ethos of environment and social responsibility of businesses and equip them with holistic thinking and skills to handle varied sustainability challenges in a dynamic and unpredictable environment. The curriculum is designed to develop and hone management and leadership skills to formulate and solve problems at the appropriate scale, and help students recognize the inter-connectedness of economic performance of business with social and environmental systems. Students would also be able to produce policy relevant results. The students meeting the programme requirements are awarded the degree - Masters in Business Administration - Sustainable Management.

#### Final placements for 2018-2020 batch

The recruitment drive witnessed the participation of 40 recruiters for a pool of 28 students. The roles offered to the students varied from Managerial positions in the domains of Business Development, Technology Management, Consulting, Operations, Project Management, Leadership Trainees and Program Management which indicated the importance of sustainability for these businesses and how they have embedded it into their systems.

Some of the top recruiters across different sectors were Accenture, KPMG, E&Y, Axtria from the consulting domain and, Aarti Industries from manufacturing. The energy sector saw the ascent of Amplus Solar, Fourth Partner Energy Limited, while education firms like FIITJEE and Centum Learning offered placement offers to the students. The process also witnessed the participation of some fastest growing start-ups in their respective domain like Moglix in Tech-Space, Agrostar in Ag-Tech and Husk Power in Energy.

It is a one-year full-time residential programme.

The programme is rigorous and rewarding. It provides an opportunity for personal development and professional growth through inquiry and insight obtained in an interactive learning environment. Noida, the hub of commercial and industrial activity, provides IIML-NC a location-specific advantage. Industry-related assignments form an integral part of the course curriculum.

IPMX has an academic schedule of four terms with each term involving a number of short projects on relevant business issues. The programme provides a firm grounding in concepts of general management and offers student opportunities to specialize in their areas.

#### **CORE courses:**

Focuses on enhancing awareness, understanding and decision making capabilities in the areas of general management in a global business setting. There are 14.5 compulsory core course credits.

#### **Elective Courses:**

Focuses on meeting the specific career goals of students. Provides deeper understanding of the subjects and ability to think beyond the obvious. Each student has to complete 9 credits of elective.

#### **Course of Independent Study**

Provides opportunity for the student to explore a

topic in depth in an area of special interest under the supervision of a faculty. It is either an exploratory type or a prescriptive type with a focus on its applicability to management situations.

#### **Placements**

The institute conducts a rolling recruitment process for IPMX (International Programme in Management for Executives) participants at Noida Campus, which is spread over a few months allowing participants and recruiters an equal opportunity to interact with each other and find their desired fit. Career Development Services (CDS) Office supports and encourages participants to find their preferred career options and guides them throughout the process of conducting the placements.

The 12<sup>th</sup> batch of IPMX was the largest ever batch out of the 12 batches that graduated, with 101 participants from various industry and functional backgrounds such as Automotive, BFSI, Consulting, E-Commerce, Healthcare, Infrastructure, IT/ITES, Manufacturing, Power/Energy/Oil and Gas, PSUs, and Others. It was a heterogeneous class of professionals from different walks of life. The work experience ranged from 5 years to 20 years with an average of 8.3 years.

This year 97 participants signed in for placement assistance from the institute. The process commenced in the second week of October 2019 at Noida Campus.

More than 90 companies participated in the placement process though on campus and off- campus modes. Off-campus process includes inviting profiles and interviews though telephone/VC or at the recruiter's office. This year, we witnessed 40% new recruiters participating in the placements.

IIM Lucknow Enterprise Incubation Center (registered as section 8 company Not for Profit) is setup and established by IIM Lucknow at Noida campus. The incubator is supported by the Dept. of Science & Technology, Govt of India and UP State Govt.

This is a sector agnostic business incubator with the focus on light asset technology 4.0 based start-ups such as AI, AR/VR, IoT etc. To support this initiative IIML-EIC is setting up "Artificial Intelligence Lab" which would be one of the first AI lab in IIMs fraternity. L Incubator has also partnered with HPCL, ONGC, GAIL, NFL and IAN for providing Corporate venture fund to incubated startups. L Incubator has also partnered with technology leaders such as Amazon AWS and Google for providing incentives up to \$20,000 as cloud credit to our incubated startups.

The incubation center facilitates to explore, understand and turn tech ideas into reality by providing required mentoring support and access to ecosystem resources.

# Section 6 Executive Education


#### **Management Development Programme**

Established in 1984, Indian Institute of Management Lucknow, since its inception, has been a leading authority in quality enhancement among corporate and public systems by influencing leadership and management practices. Creation of Management Development Programme (MDP) department in 1985 is one such initiative. The MDP department has initiated a wide variety of programmes and activities aimed at developing leadership and competitiveness in the industry. Each programme is designed to address the distinct needs of specific executives at various points in their career, helping them enhance their skill sets and progress.

#### The main objectives of the Management Development Programmes (MDP) are:

- Provide education, training, and consultancy to corporate and public systems.
- Develop and enhance leadership through people.
- Upgrade management skills.
- Improve the competitiveness of private and public sectors by catalyzing innovation of new methods, building capacity and quality enhancement.

The programmes offered by MDP pertain to general management as well as all functional areas. Programmes conducted by IIM Lucknow mainly are of three types -

- Faculty-driven Open Programmes.
- Customized programmes to cater to the specific needs of industry.
- Certification Programmes.

These courses are designed with the intention of offering organizations' area focused industry-integrated up-skilling. MDP offers focused training in many areas which would be relevant across bands, roles and job definitions in any vertical or sector.

The programmes offer range from fundamentals, helping executives shifting from one functional area to another to programmes focusing on specific topics to help executives take up specific higher responsibilities. IIM Lucknow conducts internationally patterned certification programmes for executives of corporate and government officials. One year part-time Certificate Management Programmes are designed for such purpose. These programmes have been meticulously designed to inculcate strong conceptual frameworks in business and management skills to integrate advanced management theories with real-world business practices. At present MDP is conducting two such programmes namely Certificate Programme in General Management for Executives (CPGME) and Certificate Programme in Business Analytics for Executives (CPBAE). As part of the corporate social responsibility, IIM Lucknow conducts six months General Management Programme for Defence Officers. The objective of the programme is to facilitate the smooth second career transition of the Defence Officers into the corporate world and familiarize them with contemporary management practices. The programmes can be conducted at either of our campuses (Lucknow or Noida) or the location desired by the client organization.

#### Visioning exercise for UP Government (Manthan) and its Impact

In order to support Uttar Pradesh Government in its vision of one trillion USD state economy (GSDP) and to prioritize government activities, IIM Lucknow conducted a specially designed three-day brainstorming workshop for council of ministers and top administrative officers of all the departments of Uttar Pradesh government. The workshop involved a multi subject area training required for envisioning; facilitating exchange of ideas from policymakers; collecting their agreed goals for the state along with informing them the micro and macro concrete outcomes of exercise. There were faculty members from across the academic areas were tasked with that lead by the Director, Prof. Archana Shukla herself. At the end of the workshop, participants collectively agreed on five priority areas for the state: (i) improvement of the basic infrastructure to support economic activities; (ii) enhancement of industrial development through enhanced ease of doing business and strengthening MSMEs; (iii) sustainable approach to agriculture and allied activities; (iv) higher focus on human development indicators, particularly health and education; (v) improvement of law and order in the state for holistic development; and (vi) urban development.

#### **Direct Impact**

It was a hugely successful exercise from a policy impact perspective. Some of the known and visible effects of the exercise within one year are listed below-

- UP Government created a committee of key ministers in chairmanship of Chief Minister to implement accepted priorities and goals. The committee regularly meets to monitor the progress.
- Manthan report were circulated across all the government offices.
- Exercise culminated in UP Government inviting formal and detailed proposal for long-term advisory services on developing one trillion state economy few months back.
- Follow-up exercises of Manthan for individual departments to align them for the larger goal. Some of them were carried out by IIM Lucknow itself such as for Mandi Parishad and Industries and Infrastructure department before covid -19 pandemic hit.



#### **Indirect Impact**

Chief Minister of UP, Shri Yogi Adityanath, stated myriad of intangible advantage as well derived from the collective thinking enforced and facilitated by IIM Lucknow. He said it provided an opportunity for the ministers and the bureaucrats to share a platform and exchange ideas, experiences, and knowledge in order to have an effective administration and take the state to new heights on every development indicator. While the government may have vision, ideas, and resources to get the work done, yet, it is not successful every time because the implementation of strategies has its own challenges. However, this platform provided opportunity of open discussions and conversations, ministers and administrators can learn about the practical problems which arise during implementation and work together to find out solutions for the same. He emphasized that these exercises will act as a golden opportunity to create synergy between the departments and learn about how to work in collaboration with each other.

# LIBRARY: THE LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE

Operating from a spacious building of about 30,000 square feet, fully air-conditioned, centrally located and functionally designed building with a seating capacity of 250 readers in five halls, the library is operating in a fully automated environment. The library is equipped with ergonomically designed furniture, fittings, and fixtures. Integrated library management software is in place. Entire library resources are bar-coded, and an On-Line Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is giving information about its resources. The active collection of the library is tagged with the RFID tags, and the RFID System has been installed for surveillance, issue return and other operations related to AMH (Automated Material Handling) operations. Gyanodaya is the center of attraction for academics, researchers, and students. Keeping in view the vision and mission of the Institute, Gyanodaya Library: The Learning Resource Centre was established. The objective of Gyanodaya is "to promote knowledge generation and application through its effective dissemination." The library acts as the main learning resource center and caters to the information needs of the Institute's teaching, training, research and consultancy programmes. It is well equipped in subjects' collection containing information relevant to the mandate of the Institute. The library has a substantial collection of Books, Journals and Research Databases in various formats

# Library-Noida Campus

#### 1. Overview:

Recognising the role of library and information services in meeting the requirements of the Institute's academic, research and training programmers, the Library was set-up as one of the key divisions of the Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow - Noida Campus.

Stocking a core collection of around 9,000 select learning resources in the discipline of management and related areas, in a variety of formats and operating from a spacious, centrally located, air-conditioned 2nd floor of the Administrative block, built on most modern lines, equipped with ergonomically designed furniture and fittings, the library caters to the information needs of its highly demanding clientele, by offering a wide range of Information Technology (IT) based (and value-added) services and products. It has a seating capacity for sixty users.





#### 2. Print Resources:

The library has grown to a reasonable number of around 7400 documents since its inception. The selection of the documents is made carefully by the concerned faculty, keeping in mind the requirements of the students. During the period of the report, the value additions to the library in terms of learning resources are given as under:

- 2.1 286 select volumes of documents in the form of Books, in the discipline of management and allied areas, were acquired. The amount involved in purchase of books in the reporting year 2019-2020 was Rs. 5.71 lakhs. A total of 50 periodicals in print form were subscribed during the year and the amount spent on print + online periodicals was Rs. 38.19 lakhs.
- 2.2 All the documents acquired during the period of the report were technically processed, and the bibliographical data of these documents were stored in LIBSYS.

#### 3. E-resources:

All the e-resources available in Lucknow library are accessible in Noida Campus also through Gyanodaya portal, using the intranet. This facility is heavily used by the faculty as well as the students. The OPAC gives searching facility for both the libraries.

#### 4. Facilities and Services:

The library has an enthusiastic staff to assist the users. The core services of the library are Circulation, Reference, Database searching, Inter-Library Loan (ILL), External Membership and Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC).

- 4.1 Using an automated circulation system, the library provided core services to its users, like issue/return, reminders, recalls, statistical data generations, report generation, reservations and giving answers to other reference queries.
- 4.2 Total 1359 documents were circulated during the period of the report.
- 4.3 The OPAC (On-line Public Access Catalogue) is accessible through LAN within the campus, which gives search facility for Noida and Lucknow library both.
- 4.4 Several ready and long range reference/information queries were attended to during the year.
- 4.5 Database searching, on behalf of library users, was one of the significant activities of the reference section. Total of 39 articles was searched and arranged for the users with the help of consortia libraries to help them in their research activities.

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- 4.6 Besides this, the hands-on training sessions for the new batches of PGPWE, IPMX, PGPSM and EFPM students were also conducted by the library staff.
- 4.7 Documents, not held by the library, were arranged from other libraries using the Inter Library Loan service. Total of 30 books were arranged from Lucknow library for the users.
- 4.8 Nineteen external members were served during the year. Out of this, 3 members took the annual membership, and 16 were casual members (daily, weekly, monthly).
- 4.9 Twelve monthly library statistics reports were generated and sent to the authorities.
- 4.10 With the computer lab shifting to the library, the usage of library reading area and lab has grown tremendously. The library has become the favourite space for the students 24x7.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the accounts of the Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow for the year ended 31 March, 2020

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow (Institute) as at 31 March 2020, the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 23 (3) of the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. The audit observation on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiencycum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Based on our audit, we report that:

 We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;

(ii) The Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the Formats of Financial Statements for Central Higher Educational Institutions (format) prescribed by MHRD. (iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow as required under Section 23 (1) of Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017.

(iv) We further report that:

#### (A) General

(A.1) Lease premium of ₹ 1466.30 lakh paid for lease hold land allotted by NOIDA Administration for a period of 90 years needs to be amortized over the lease period.

(A.2) Receipts and Payments Account includes ₹ 98.61 lakh, a non-realistic paymentas 'Change in Current Assets/Liabilities'. Inclusion of a non-realistic transaction in Receipts and Payments Account is against the accounting principles.

(A.3) Following heads have not been incorporated in the Receipts and Payments Account as required in the format:

- Receipts and payments in respect of Earmarked/Endowment funds.
- Income on Investment from Earmarked/Endowment funds.
- Investment encashed and investment made out of Earmarked/Endowment funds and other funds.
- Receipt and payment in respect of capital expenses.
- Transactions in respect of Deposits and Advances.
- Other payments including statutory payments.

#### (B) Grants-in-aid

The Institute did not receive any Grants-in-aid from the Government of India during 2019-20.

#### (C) Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Institute through a management letter issued separately for remedial/ corrective action.

(v) Subject to observation in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

(vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.

#### Annexure

#### 1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System

Internal audit is conducted by a hired Chartered Accountant Firm under monitoring of Audit Committee comprising senior faculty members and officers. Internal audit had been completed up to quarter ending March, 2020.

#### 2. Adequacy of Internal Control System

Internal Control System of the Institute reflects following deficiencies:

- Non settlement of advance on capital account given to M/s R B Constructions.
- Although income of the Institute is exempted under section 10(23C), administration could not convince their bankers not to deduct undue tax on interest on investments. Moreover, obtaining the refund from Income Tax Department was not pursued effectively/promptly.

#### 3. System of physical verification of Fixed Assets

Last physical verification was conducted in 2013-14. However, it was under progress in 2020-21.

#### 4. System of Physical Verification of Inventories

Physical verification of inventories had been conducted as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020.

## SCHEDULE 22 - Significant Accounting Policies

## **1.** Basis for Preparation of Accounts:

- 1.1 The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis, unless stated otherwise.
- 1.2 The Institute has presented its Financial Statements according to Revised Financial Reporting format, given by MHRD for "Central Higher Educational Institutions".

### 2. Revenue Recognition:

- 2.1 Misc. Receipts, CAT income, Sale of Admission Forms and Interest on Saving Bank Accounts are accounted on cash basis. Fees from students of various programs including MDP & Consultancy Fee are collected on periodical basis and are accounted on accrual basis.
- 2.2 Income from Land, Buildings and Other Property and Interest on Investments are accounted on accrual basis.
- 2.3 Interest on interest bearing advances to staff for House Building, Purchase of Vehicles and Computers is accounted on accrual basis every year, though the actual recovery of interest starts after the full repayment of the Principal.

### 3. Fixed Assets & Depreciation:

- 3.1 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and commissioning.
- 3.2 Fixed Assets are classified into Tangible & Intangible Assets as advised by CAG.
- 3.3 The depreciation is provided on Straight Line Method (SLM) for all assets purchased since 2017-18 and depreciation is provided on WDV for assets purchased before 2017-18.
- 3.4 Along with the reclassification of assets, amount of accumulated depreciation has also been transferred to the respective block of assets.

### 4. Intangible Assets:

4.1 E Journals are being treated as Institute's Intangible Assets and shown separately.

### 5. Stocks:

Expenditure on purchase of Stationary/Printing material & electrical items are accounted for as revenue expenditure after adjustment of value of closing stock held as on 31<sup>st</sup> March. The closing stocks is valued at cost.

### 6. Retirement:

- 6.1 Towards Gratuity of employees, a Group Gratuity Scheme is instituted through LIC (as Fund Manager) by constituting an independent Fund, which manages the gratuity liability and it is in operation since 2001-02.
- 6.2 Liability on account of accumulated leave encashment benefit to the employees has been assessed and provided for. This provision has been kept under Leave Encashment Funds and being managed by the Institute.
- 6.3 Provision for pension liability as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2016-17 in respect of employees who had joined on or before 31.12.2003 has been assessed by actuarial form and accordingly required extra Fund is being provided in installment. 4<sup>th</sup> Installment of ₹ 20 crores is being added during this year. It is to mention that Pension Liability is underfunded.
- 6.4 In respect of employees who joined the Institute on or after 01.01.2004, Contributory Pension Scheme is under operation and the same is discharged by the Institute to the IIML EPF Trust, Lucknow concurrently.

## 7. Investments:

7.1 All the Investments are held for long term hence valued at cost. Renewal of the Investments has been done as and when required.

## 8. Earmarked/Endowment Funds:

All the long terms funds are earmarked for specific purposes. Out of these Pension Fund have separate Bank Account. Those with large balances also have investments in Term Deposits with Banks. The accrual interest income from investments and interest on Savings Bank Accounts of Pension Fund is credited to the respective Fund. The expenditure are debited to the funds. The assets created out of Earmarked Funds where the ownership Vests in the Institution, are merged with the assets of the Institution by crediting an equal amount to the Capital Fund. The balance in the respective funds is carried forward and is represented on the assets side by the balance at Bank, Investment and accrued interest.

## 9. Investment of Earmarked Funds and Interest Income Accrued on Such Investments:

To the extent not immediately required for expenditure or amount added at the end of the Financial Year as provision for the year, the amount available against such funds are invested in approved Government Bonds or deposited for fixed term with Banks, leaving the balance in Savings Bank Accounts (wherever applicable).

Interest received, interest accrued & due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the Institution.

## 10. Sponsored & Consulting Projects:

- 10.1 In respect of ongoing Consulting Projects, the amounts received from sponsors are credited in the group, "Current Liabilities and Provisions" and when expenditure is incurred/advances are paid against such projects., are shown in the group Loans, Advances & Deposits.
- 10.2 In respect of sponsored scholarships, amount received from sponsors are credited to 'Scholarship Others Received' and on its payment, to students, it is debited to 'Scholarship Others Paid' account under PGP Expenditure.

## 11. Income Tax

The income of the Institution is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts.
