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ABOUT NITIE

NITIE was established as an autonomous Institute in 1963 by the Government of India with the assistance of the United Nations Development Program through the International Labour Organization.

NITIE offers:

- A Fellowship Program, which is recognized as equivalent to a Ph. D. of an Indian University.
- A two-year Post-Graduate Program in Industrial Engineering (PGDIE), Industrial Management (PGDIM), and Sustainability Management (PGDSM).
- A six-month General Management Program (GMP) for Defense Personnel.
- Jointly a one-year full-time Post-Graduate Diploma for Executives–Visionary Leadership for Manufacturing (PGDEX-VLFM) with IIT Delhi. This program is specially designed for experienced engineers with 4-10 years of experience in the manufacturing domain.

In addition, NITIE has been conducting several short-term Management Development Programs of short duration in various areas of Industrial Engineering and Management. The training programs of NITIE emphasize learning with a purpose.

Besides training, NITIE is also engaged in applied research and offers consultancy in the various facets of Industrial Engineering, Operations Research, Decision Sciences, Sustainability Management, Marketing Management, Finance, Economics and Strategy, Organization Behaviour and Human Resource Management, Project Management and Manufacturing Management.

All India Council for Technical Education. The earlier programme Post Graduate Industrial Safety & Environmental Management is now renamed as Post Graduate Diploma in Sustainability Management (PGDSM).The PGDSM programme has a focus on the environment and sustainability.

Admissions to PGDSM courses are open to full-time graduates of all branches of engineering/technology. The candidates must have to aggregate 60% marks (relaxable by 5% in case of SC/ST/PWD candidates) with a valid GATE/CAT/GMAT/ GRE score. Candidates appearing for the final year of Engineering/Technology can also apply. Industry Sponsored candidates fulfilling eligibility criteria are also considered for admission. The students of the 21st Batch PGDSM (2021-23) have completed their 7th Module and have been placed in various organizations. 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PSYCHOLOGY LABORATORY

Coordinator: Prof. S.K. Nair

The Psychology Lab was established in 1998 under the MHRD's Modernization and Removal of Obsolescence Scheme, 1997, to create a repository (archive) of psychometric tests which can be used for psychological assessments of the students. In addition, the laboratory was envisaged to help achieve the students' holistic development regarding their managerial competencies, including their overall personality, interpersonal skills, leadership skills, group behaviour, and stress management. The facility was subsequently extended to the industry executives who attended short-term executive development programmes at NITIE. Dr Shreekumar K. Nair, Professor (OB & HRM), coordinates the laboratory. In addition, various facilities are available in the centre:

- Psychometric/psychological tests for assessment of intelligence, personality, and other psychological dimensions 71 nos.
- Apparatus/Materials for conducting experimental research in human cognition, learning and perception and for demonstrating certain psychological phenomena 42 nos.

Centre Outcomes:

- (a) Helping the Faculty and Fellow students working in OB and HRM use psychometric tests and questionnaires for their research.
- (b) Using the tests for PGP, MDP & UBP classroom teaching by the OB and HR faculty.
- (c) Using the psychometric tests in the classroom as a part of the self-awareness and skill-building exercise. These tests help the students systematically understand their soft skills, attitudes, and overall personality.
- (d) The PGP courses for which the psychometric tests in the Psychology Lab are used include core courses such as Organizational Behaviour, Human Resource Management, and Business Communication, as well as elective courses such as Positive Psychology in Organization, Cognitive Psychology, Theories & Assessment of Personality, Soft Skills Development, and Leadership Development.

DIGITAL MANUFACTURING LABORATORY

Introduction and Objectives of the Laboratory

The Digital Manufacturing Laboratory (DML), formerly known as the AMCE (Advanced Manufacturing Centre of Excellence), was established through a DST project under FIST (Funds for Improvement of Science and Technology) during 2006-07. The objective of the Digital Manufacturing Laboratory was to support teaching, research, and outreach in the various manufacturing areas.

Resources

The DML had three professors: Professor Milind Akarte, Prof. Vivek Khanzode, and Professor Balkrishna Narkhede. During the year, the DML had the following facilities:

1. Software:

- One user license of AnyLogic Simulation software.
- Witness 2006 Simulation software.
- CNC-Train, FMS-CIM, and M-Robot software.

2. Hardware

- Reverse Engineering EIN Scan Pro handheld 3D Scanner.
- Ultimaker 3 extended Rapid Prototyping System (3D Printer).
- FMS/CIM setup including XL Mill, XL Turn, Aristo Robots, Automated Storage/ Retrieval (AS/RS) systems, Automated Guided Vehicle (AGV), and Automatic Assembly Station.

Laboratory Activities

Some of the important activities carried out by the DML from April 2022 – March 2023 are as below:

1. DGMP-03 batch students were given the demonstration of the Additive Manufacturing facility available in the DML as a part of their course titled "Smart Manufacturing – simulation and Optimization." In addition, the batch actively participated in the layered manufacturing process demonstrated to them.

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- 2. Mr Sujay Pradhan, Assistant Manager of Kansai Nerolac Paint, India, visited Digital Manufacturing Lab (DML) on January 16. 2023 to understand the concept of Additive Manufacturing and witness the part fabrication process by AM technology. All the steps of fabricating the physical part model from a CAD model, including the layer-by-layer process of AM, were demonstrated during the visit. FDM AM technology available in the DML was witnessed and experienced by Mr Sujay Pradhan during his visit
- 3. The concept of Additive Manufacturing Technology and the process of fabricating the physical part model from a 3D CAD model was discussed and demonstrated to the Section-D students of the Institute as a part of their course, Cyber-Physical System.
- 4. Mr Vishwas Dohale, a research scholar, defended his final thesis titled "*Quantification* of the Strategic Fit Between Process Choice Criteria and Production Systems." on 25 January 2023. He was working with prof Milind Akarte of DML and Professor Priyanka Verma as a co-guide.

LIBRARY

The National Institute of Industrial Engineering (NITIE) Library has been a learning and knowledge resource centre for the academic community of NITIE since 1965. Keeping in view of the increasing collection and service of the library, in 2016 library moved into the new premises at the "Academic cum Library Building" with more space and facilities on three floors. The library's entire area (i.e., 1433.39 sq. m) is centrally air-conditioned with proper lights, adequate seating capacity, secured Wi-fi connection and other fundamental amenities. All these have made the library a conducive place for learning and research.

The NITIE Library is enriched with intellectually stimulating collections of Technical Books, Reference books, Journals (including print & online), Electronic databases, and Educational Software in Industrial Engineering, Management, and its allied subjects. Moreover, since the Institute has a residential campus, the library plays a vital role in providing information to staff, officers, campus residents, and students.

Collection:

The objective of the NITIE library is to facilitate the creation of new knowledge through acquiring, organising, and disseminating knowledge resources and providing value-added services. One room has been identified in the NITIE Library, and 11 PCs have been installed for library users. In addition, the library has dedicated terminals for Bloomberg and GABI software.

New Library Advisory Committee Chair has been nominated since 26.04.2022 was constituted vide order no. D/Office Order/2022, dated 26.04.2022. The tenure of the committee chair is valid till 25.04.2024. During the year, three library committee meetings were organized to decide on library development, book procurement, and subscription renewal of existing E-resources.

Library Team:

The Library is managed by three professionals, 4 Administrative staff, 1 MTS, 1 Library Intern, 1 Data Entry Operator and 03 Casual Labours. An additional charge of the "Library and Information Officer (LIO)" of NITIE Library has been given to one of the Professors since 15.03.2022. The team handles important library activities like Collection Development, Maintenance, Circulation, Reference, and other allied service.

NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF INDUSTRIAL ENGINEERING

NITIE DISPENSARY

The National Institute of Industrial Engineering's (NITIE's) Dispensary is well managed with qualified Paramedical and Medical staff members under the control and guidance of the **Medical Officer**. The dispensary is the backbone of the Health of the NITIE community.

NITIE Dispensary is open every day for 12 hours, morning from 9.00 am to 9.00 pm. The daily patient attendance is approximately 80-85 numbers. NITIE Dispensary services all PGP, PhD, and DGMP Students, including all staff, faculty members, and their families.

Emergency cases were handled promptly and immediately during night hours also. Our Medical team has reinforced our knowledge and acumen with confidence in treating the NITIE community cautiously 24x7 under the supervision of a Medical officer.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Medical team attended to all the patients and needy on time in 24/7 services, ensuring the safety rules.

The NITIE Dispensary has a **Paramedical Staff Nurse, Pharmacist** and **Medical Officer** for **24 hours** to attend emergencies. Day to Day basis medicines are dispensed, including Intravenous injectables. Service has been provided for the last 30 years without interruption and with dedication.

The Following visiting Doctors' are available in Dispensary.

1) **Ophthalmologist**: One consulting Ophthalmologist visits NITIE Dispensary weekly for 2 hours and takes care of all the patients.

- 2) **Paediatrics**: One Paediatrician visits NITIE Dispensary twice weekly for two hours.
- 3) **Physician**: The physician consulting Doctor visits NITIE Dispensary three/five days a week for two hours.
- 4) **Dentist**: One Dental Consulting Doctor visits NITIE Dispensary two/three days a week for 4 hours.
- 5) **Homeopathy**: Three hours twice a week, homoeopathy medicines and consultations are available for NITIE Community by qualified doctors.
- 6) **Orthopaedic**: One consulting orthopaedic doctor visits NITIE Dispensary for two hours a week.
- 7) **Physiotherapist**: A physiotherapist consultant is always available for three hours in NITIE Dispensary from Monday to Saturday to take care of NITIE Student and Employee community.
- 8) **Ambulance Service**: One full fledge ready Ambulance has been hired on a contract and made available 24X7 to NITIE Community.
- 9) **Medical Officer**: Medical officer has completed sessions in Clinical Cardiology and obtained two certificates.
 - i) Fellowship in clinical cardiology
 - ii) The advanced certificate in clinical cardiology

NITIE Community has been a beneficiary of these services provided by Dispensary.

SECURITY & TRANSPORT

The security &Transport Section is under the Administration department. The superintendent (Security and Transport) manages the Security & Transport department and reports to Registrar through Deputy Registrar (Administration).

All the Security personnel are unarmed with no arrest powers; only they can detain a person in doubt or miscreant. Security personnel patrolled the entire campus, General support, and VIP/ guest movement support services.

The security personnel are always on high alert. NITIE has 63 acres of land, and its surrounding has been dwelled by encroached dwellers, which is challenging for security personnel.

Time and again, the encroachers are involved in the construction extension with the present occupied structure, which needs high vigilance and prevention. Whenever such incidents occur, security personnel deployed in NITIE premises take up the matter with BMC and Powai Police Station for the legal course. NITIE has one security guard (Watchman); NITIE has outsourced 58 nos. of Security personnel from Maharashtra State Security Corporation (MSSC).

NITIE Security & Transport department has one bus that provides transport facilities to our students. The bus is off-road, effective from 01 May 2019, as it has been completed for 15 years. However, when the need arises, the vehicles are hired from a travel agency to provide student transport facilities. In addition, the Institute has two office cars, one Corolla car and the other Innova Crysta Car, solely used for the official travel of the Institute's Director. Institute has fencing with Iron Bar on the Campus. In addition, Institute has taken up work for the RCC wall to the fencing of the Campus, and it is in progress.

Assets in the Department: The S&T department has one Corolla Car, purchased in 2013, and the other is an Innova Crysta Car solely used for the official travel of the Institute's Director official purposes.

Security & Transport Department has taken up the following activities for 2022-23.

- Republic Day and Independence Day Celebration. The Institute has celebrated Republic Day and Independence Day. Security personnel performed the Parade and gave a guard of honour to the National flag.
 - Mock drill on Fire and Fire Alarms. The Mock drill was carried out on Fire precautions and Fire alarms.
 - Meetings with Police were held with local Police to seek their support in the encroachment and Security related matters.

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NITIE, Mumbai, going ahead with its contribution to the FIT India movement and looking for so much enthusiasm for cricket, organizing two cricketing events:

- NITIE Premier League (NPL)
- Kamagar Cup League (KCL)

NPL and KPL are based on the format of the 'Indian Premier League' with a reduction in playing overs and game duration. The events start with team auctions in which all the prospective team owners come up to buy a team with bidding; whomsoever bids higher gets the team. Eight teams will go for auctions, and owners will bid for them to buy. Post that, virtual money is assigned to each team owner to buy players and make their team through player auctions. As these auctions event conclude, these teams are divided into four groups, each for group-stage matches based on the point table and run rates. The top two teams from each group qualify for the semi-final. Further, two winning teams qualify for the final. The event concludes with the final match and an award ceremony for the winners and the runner-up team.



All NITIE students from all batches and branches participate in the NPL, which is arranged and played similarly to the KCL. The KCL consists of eight teams played by all NITIE employees, faculty, and fellows. Each team has 15 players, of whom 11 are picked for the game. Thus, the total direct participation of KCL is 120 cutting across all functions of NITIE Mumbai. Both NPL and KCL last for 4-5 days of play.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

For the financial year 2022-2023, the Ministry of Education (MoE) has sanctioned and released an amount of Rs.61,51,00,000/-(Rs.6151.00 lakhs) towards Grant-in-Aid to the Institute. The details are as below:

Grant in Aid - An amount of Rs.21,05,00,000/- (Rupees Twenty One Crore Five Lakhs Only) under OH-31 (Non-salary), Rs.8,31,00,000/- (Eight Crore Thirty-One Lakhs Only) under OH-35 (Creation of Capital assets), and Rs.32,15,00,000/- (Rupees Thirty-Two Crores Fifteen Lakhs Only) under OH-36 (Salary) was sanctioned during the Financial Year 2022-2023 by GOI, Ministry of Education (MoE) to NITIE, Mumbai.

Total Expenditure is Rs.1,51,68,54,311/- and the expenditure under OH-31 is Rs.97,43,18,619/-, For OH-35 is Rs.15,69,82,299/- and OH-36 is Rs.38,55,53,393/-. Closing balance as on 31^{st} March 2023 is - Rs.6,41,20,914/- (overspent).

The closing balance amount as on 31.03.2023 under OH-35 (Capital Assets) is overspent of - Rs.7,38,82,299/- and unutilized balance under OH-31(Non Salary) is NIL and under OH-36 (Salary) is Rs.97,61,385/-

OH - 31 (Non-Salary)

Total expenditure accounted under this head is Rs.97,43,18,619/-, and actual expenditure is Rs.69,42,23,106/-. An amount of Rs.7,00,23,828/- has been transferred to the building fund, Rs.4,20,14,327/- has been transferred to R & D Fund and Rs.8,40,28,654/- has been transferred to contribution towards Corpus fund, balance (surplus) of Rs.8,40,28,654/- has been transferred to Capital fund of Main Account. Therefore, an amount of Rs.21,05,00,000/- (Grant in Aid from Ministry) is fully utilized and shown as expenditure on OH - 31 (Non-Salary). The remaining expenditure amount is adjusted from the Internal Revenue Generated (IRG) of the Institute, and accordingly, the unspent balance shown is NIL.

OH – 35 (Creation of Capital Assets)

An amount of Rs.12,72,19,695/- which was overspent as of 31.3.2022, has been adjusted from the Internal Generated Revenue during the financial year 2022-2023 as per the fiscal policy of MoE vid F.No.3-6/2019/ TS VIII dated 20.12.2019 and approval of BoG minutes no.155 dated 16.1.2020. The total expenditure

accounted under this head is Rs.15,69,82,299/- (Please refer to Schedule 4 Additions – Deletions during the year). The said amount also has been reflected under Schedule 1 towards the extent of utilized amount for Capital Expenditure during the year 2022-2023. Therefore, an amount of - Rs.7,38,82,299 is reflected as overspent as of 31.3.2023, which will be adjusted during the next Financial year, 2023-2024. It is expected that certain plan components as a supplementary grant for the previous year's overspent will be received from Ministry.

OH - 36 (Salary)

An amount of Rs.38,55,53,393/- under this head is bifurcated from Income and Expenditure as an expenditure (please refer to Schedule 15). Since pension and ex-gratia are components of OH 31, the same have been excluded from Schedule 15. **An amount of Rs.97,61,385**/- **is the unspent balance as of 31.3.2023.**

Details of Institute Bank Accounts:

The Institute maintains separate Bank accounts for the funds received from the government under Plan (OH-35) and Non-Plan grants (OH-31& OH-36). Funds are banked at Canara Bank and State Bank of India. Details of all operating accounts are mentioned below.

RIGHT TO INFORMATION ACT 2005 - (2022-23)

Right to Information (RTI) is an Act of the Indian Parliament enforced in 2005 to provide a practical regime for citizens to secure access to information under the control of public authorities. This aims to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority.

The basic object of the Right to Information Act is to empower the citizens, to promote transparency and accountability in the working of the Government, to contain corruption, and to enhance people's participation in the democratic process, thereby making our democracy work for the people in a real sense. It goes without saying that an informed citizen is better equipped to keep necessary vigil on the governance instruments and make the government more accountable to the governed. Therefore, the Act is a big step towards informing the citizens about the government's activities.

NITIE, Mumbai, an Autonomous Institute under the Ministry of Education (MoE), is covered under this act.

Director, NITIE is the Appellate Authority, and Registrar has been designated as Central Public Information Officer to deal with the request for information and assist the persons seeking information. In addition, the Heads of the Departments/Sections are designated as Public Information Officers.
