IIM Trichy commenced its academic journey in June 2011 with 84 students in the first year of its Post Graduate Programme in Management (PGPM). IIM Tiruchirappalli is governed by professional members who are some of the most reputed and distinguished personalities in their own fields like finance, law, education, entrepreneurship, advertising, etc.

IIM Trichy offered three academic programmes till March 2019:

- Post Graduate Programme in Management
- Post Graduate Programme in Business Management
- Fellowship Programme in Management

Post Graduate Programme in Management (PGPM) is the flagship programme of the institute. 189 students from all over the country enrolled for this programme in 2018-2020 batch. During the period, a total of 378 students were on the rolls of IIM Trichy across all the courses.

Post Graduate Programme in Business Management (PGPBM), the 3-year executive programme for working executives was launched in August 2012. Thirty-six students were admitted to the programme during the year.

During the year 2018-19, two students were admitted in the Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) of IIM Trichy. The candidates were selected through a rigorous selection process.

The seventh annual convocation of IIM Trichy was held on 30th March 2019 in IIM Tiruchirappalli Campus. It was a proud moment for all the IIMTians. Shri. M. M Murugappan, Executive Chairman, Murugappa Group as the Chief Guest and delivered the Convocation Address. During the convocation, 167 students of the PGPM 2017-2019 batch and 02 students of PGPM 2016-2018 batch were awarded Master of Business Administration degree and 41 students (2 students of PGPBM 2015-18 Batch and 39 students of PGPBM 2016-18 Batch) from Post Graduate Programme in Business Management were awarded Master of Business Administration degree. I am glad to report that IIM Trichy has constituted eleven gold medals and a Cash Award which were awarded to the meritorious students of the batch by the Chief Guest and the Chairman, Board of Governors during the convocation. HDFC Bank and Punjab National Bank sponsored two gold medals, Canara Bank and Kotak Securities sponsored one gold medal each for the meritorious students.

During 2018-19, International Relations Office (IRO) had sent 5 students on outbound exchange as part of the International Exchange Programme. Two inbound exchange students from EM Lyon Business School spent their Term V at our institute as part of the International Exchange Programme.

TEQIP is a World Bank assisted project initiated by the Ministry of Human Resource Development which aims at building academic leadership and improving the quality of Technical education in the country.

Post Graduate Programme in Management

The Post Graduate Programme in Management (PGPM) at IIM Tiruchirappalli is the flagship programme of the Institute. The programme's main objective is to develop young women and men into competent professional managers, capable of working in any sector of organized activity, proceeding leadership and achieving excellence in performance while contributing to the welfare of the larger society.

The first year of the programme offers courses covering various disciplines exposing the students to different facets of business management. On completion of these core courses, the programme provides the option of choosing electives from a pool of specialized courses during the second year. The elective courses are designed to nurture future managers in the area of their interests, aligning them with their career goals and objectives. Students also undertake a Summer Internship Programme and a 'Make a Difference' Team project as part of the curriculum.

During the academic year 2018-2019, the seventh batch of PGPM students graduated from the programme and were awarded degree in the name of Master of Business Administration. It was the first batch to be awarded degree instead of diploma as per IIMT act 2017 gazette notification.

The eighth batch of PGPM students joined the programme and completed their first year of studies.

PGPM 2017-2019 (7th batch)

Summer Internship

The students of PGPM 2017-2019 batch undertook summer internship projects at various organizations for a period of 8-10 weeks during the months of April and May 2018. Successful completion of summer internship is a requirement for the award of the degree.

Second year course work

The second year of course work for PGPM 2017-2019 batch commenced on June 5, 2018. 172 students of the PGPM 2017-2019 batch and 02 students from the previous batch, PGPM 2016-18 who had repeated the first year course work with PGPM 2017-2019 registered for second year course work. There are 174 students promoted to second year during 2018-19, of which, 04 students gone on student exchange during Term-VI and one student has not met the credit requirements of the programme. Hence, 169 students graduated in 2019. The four students who had gone on exchange will graduate in the next academic year 2019-20. At the end of academic year, 169 students graduated from the programme, having successfully completing all the academic requirements.

Students are required to complete 45 credits of elective courses during the second year.

Course of Independent Study

The Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) is the doctoral programme of the Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli (IIMT or Institute). The FPM at IIMT encourages rigorous and interdisciplinary research in all areas of business management.

Duration of the Programme

Students are expected to complete the programme within 5 years. It is possible to complete the programme within 4 years also. The maximum duration of the programme is 7 years.

Curriculum and Programme Structure

The Programme is broadly divided into six phases of course and research work. During the first 3 phases, the student undertakes rigorous course work in her/his area of interest as well as in other areas of management. This is interspersed with a summer research project for a period of 10-12 weeks. In the second half of the program, the student independently works on the dissertation under the guidance of the Dissertation Advisory Committee.

Financial Support

FPM Students in good standing will receive a monthly stipend of Rs.30,000 till passing their Comprehensive Qualifying Exams (CQE). After clearing the CQE, the monthly stipend will be revised to Rs.36,000 till the end of their fourth year in the programme. The stipend is in addition to tuition fee waiver and for covering their living expenses, books and materials, insurance and other contingency expenses. The support can be extended for six months for a maximum of two times thereafter with the concurrence of the DAC and the FPM Committee. If extended two times, stipend will be paid till May of the student's fifth year. Students who do not avail hostel accommodation, get an additional payment of Rs 6,000/- per month towards non-residential subsidy.

A contingency grant of Rs.30,000/- per year is allowed on a reimbursement basis for purchase of hardware, software, books, databases, data collection expenses, conference expenses and any other items directly related to the programme for a maximum of 4 years. Any unspent money of the contingency grant in one year can be carried forward to future period, as long as the student is registered in the programme.

The institute will support up to Rs.2,00,000/- per student during the stay as full time students for attending national and international conferences.

A start-up grant of Rs. 50,000 (for purchase of computer hardware and software) is available when students join the programme. Any unused amount in this grant as on March 31st of the student's third year in the programme will be added to the conference grant.

Management Development Programmes

The primary objective of MDPs is to serve the educational and training needs of practicing managers under various areas of management by enhancing their knowledge and developing their skills through the learning imparted by the faculty members of IIM Trichy. There are two types of MDPs – Open as well as Customized. In the former, faculty of IIMT will propose a programme which is of his interest either by research or by expertise which is open for any executive having relevant eligibility criteria. In the later, the programme is designed by the faculty based on the requirement from a specific client for its executives at various levels.

Smart Classrooms

The passive network infrastructure of Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli is built on a combination of Star and Ring architecture enabling high availability. The active network infrastructure of the campus has been setup on a 3-tier architecture with more than 4500 node points for providing seamless connectivity all over the campus. The Gigabit network is built on a Fiber Optics backbone, which covers an area encompassing the

Administrative block, Academic block, Library, Hostels, Faculty Quarters, Guest house & Staff Quarters through wired cable as well as a wireless network. The institute has also established a VOIP network with about 200 IP phones and a IP based surveillance system integrating 100 CCTV cameras along with four monitoring stations. It can also be monitored through the web interface.

Round the clock controller based wireless internet access has been established throughout the campus, which provides seamless internet access in Admin block, academic block, Hostel block, LRC block, Sports block, Faculty Quarters and Staff Quarters with secured user authentication.



Video Conferencing Facility

Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli has a fullfledged data center in the ICT block located at the center of the campus which has precision air-conditioning, false flooring, dedicated fire protection mechanism, fireproof glass partition etc. NOC room located in the data center has the facility to monitor the entire ICT infrastructure. A disaster recovery center located at the estate office enables the core components to work on active-active which guarantees 99 % uptime.

The usage of technology in classrooms is an important talking point across all campuses. At IIM Tiruchirappalli, fully air-conditioned and acoustically treated SMART Classrooms are augmented with AV automation and video conferencing facility. It comprises of latest Audio-Visual solutions like HD Document Camera/Visualizer, Interactive tablets, DSP Mixers, centralized monitoring and control system, ceiling microphones, Ultra short throw Interactive Projectors, Full HD projectors, HD Cameras for capturing faculty and students etc.

Internal Complaints Committee

Student Achievements

It has been an eventful year for students of IIM Trichy, bagging many accolades and achieving new heights in the national arena. Two of our students, Anandakrishnan & Mandar Patil, won the meritcum-needs scholarship offered by Societe Generale Global Solutions Centre.

Nine (9) of our students from PGP 2017-18 were selected by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports as part of the Indian Youth Delegation 2018 and one of the selected students, Nandhini Nageshwaran, visited South Korea. Six of our students from PGP 2018-20 were selected by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports as part of the Indian Youth Delegation 2019 and all of them visited China to promote mutual understanding of values and culture among the youth of different countries.

Our students won the National Finals of the coveted CFA Equity Research Challenge and have qualified for the Asia Pacific finals along with teams from IIM Kozhikode and IIFT. The fact that IIM Trichy has won it 4 times in the last five years is a testament to the quality of our students and the spirit of competitiveness instilled within them.

Our students were also the national finalists of 'Mahindra War room' outshining teams from several top B-Schools in the country. The list doesn't end here as our students have consistently been the winners and finalists of several national level events conducted by top B-Schools across the country such as IIM Ahmedabad, IIM Bangalore, IIM Calcutta, IIM Kozhikode etc.







Our students have also displayed exemplary performance in individual events.

- Indranil Saha won "Kathan, HR Article Writing Competition" and was also among the 'top 25' out of more than 2 lac participants in 'Wooplr "CEO For A Month" Challenge'
- Kavya Mohan P won the national level competition Godrej Loud; and the list of achievements by our students goes on.

In sports, IIM Trichy bagged Gold in Men's Basketball and Women's Throwball in this year's edition of Sangram, the annual sports meet of the southern IIMs, held at IIM Bangalore during November. Our team also won Silver in Men's chess, women's chess, women's Basketball and women's pool.

Team IIM Trichy emerged as the champions of Khelotsav 2019, the inaugural edition of the inter B-school sports tournament held at IIM Trichy during January.



Academic Committee

Academic Committee work closely with PGPM Chairperson and PGPM office. It represents student needs and take care of all academic related issues including but not restricted to dealing with course content, electives bidding, Class Representatives' election, and attendance discrepancy. Also, work closely with Faculty Area chairs to determine electives based on batch's interest

Activities during '18-'19

Mentorship Program

This program was initiated last year so that the second year PGP students can guide first year students, both academically and personally, if needed. The program witnessed high participation - 60 from PGP 2 acted as mentors and were mapped to 177 students from PGP 1.

Your Dost

To understand students' problems and to help them cope with stress, the committee acts as a mediator between students and 'YourDost' - on campus counselling service, co-ordinating with the batch and helping them in booking appointments.

CR Elections

During first year, a class representative has multiple responsibilities such as coordinating with the faculty of all courses for assignment submissions and coordinating with PGP Office in exam papers display. In second year, Course Representatives will be selected during second year as well to co-ordinate between faculty and the section.

PGPM Academic Open House

The aim of open house is to provide a platform for students to ask any academic queries directly to the PGPM chairperson himself. It was conducted for the batch on 06th August with Prof. Godwin Tennyson clearing student queries.

Electives Selection

Based on the batch preferences, feedback from placement team and electives taught at other IIMs, the committee co-ordinates with concerned area chairpersons to add or update elective courses offered every year.

Indian Youth Delegation

Design of the Placement Report

With the successful completion of the placement process, the MR team helps the Placement team with the design and development of both the summer placement and final placement posters and report.

Mess Committee

The sole purpose of existence is to make sure that IIM Trichy fraternity gets good quality and healthy food. They govern the proper functioning of the mess and acts as a bridge between the vendors and the students. The committee always strives for betterment; therefore, it carries out inspection, follows guidelines to check and validate vendor on various parameters by stringent evaluation practices.

Activities for the year 2018-19

Kitchen

The kitchen was setup in the year 2017 with latest equipment and charge was given to the mess vendor. The kitchen facilitates efficient mess operations including storage of food. The committee ensures to have a clean storage area and hygienic kitchen all the time.

Mess Vendor

A mess vendor was chosen through the tender process by the college administration. The mess contract was awarded to **Shree Raja Rajeshwari Caterers** in the year 2017 and administration renewed the contract in November 2018 after taking feedback from Mess Committee.



Quality and Inspection

The mess committee prepared an inspection checklist document which is used for inspection of brands of the food material used by the caterer. The checklist includes parameters related to hygiene, cleanliness, quality and proper use of equipment. The committee performs surprise checks at least twice a week apart from daily monitoring the quality of food.

Initiative to Reduce Food Wastage

Mess Committee has started a campaign to reduce food wastage by pasting posters in the dining area to create awareness amongst students. Also, the quantity of food wasted each day is displayed on the menu board in the mess. Decrease of food wastage has been observed since the campaign was started.

Festival Celebrations

As India has diverse culture, so as IIM Trichy. We have students in the campus from diverse culture and Mess Committee ensures to celebrate every festival by preparing special dishes for every festival.

Student feedback and mess menu

A feedback register is available at the mess counter where students can write complaints or suggestion. Each complaint is addressed properly and both mess committee members and the mess vendor reply to each complaint. The menu is prepared and is updated regularly by taking the online feedback from the students.

Monthly Feast

A three course meal is served and the menu is designed to please the taste buds of the students and to bring a change from the monotonous weekly menu.

College Events

The mess committee works closely with other clubs and committees to support them during the events organized by them. The mess committee arranged food and beverages for the participants in the events like Dhruva, Nishtha, etc.



Sports Committee

The committee organises all the sports events on campus. It coordinates with the administration for any sports requirements with respect to infrastructure, inventory, sportswear and others. It also coordinates with other South IIMs – IIMB/K/V in organising and participation in Sangram, the Inter South-IIM Sports Meet held in the month of November. 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SCHEDULE 23 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS

- 1.1 The Financial Statements are prepared under the Historical Cost Convention method and on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the framework of accounting procedure prescribed by the MHRD for Central Higher Educational Institutions.
- 1.2 The "Revised Format of Accounts under Uniform Accounting Standard" (UAS) applicable to all Central Educational Institutions (CEIs) introduced by Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) and communicated vide letter no. 29-4/2012-IFD dated 17.04.2015 of the Joint Secretary and Financial Advisor, MHRD, GoI, Department of Higher Education, New Delhi, has been applied for the preparation of Financial Statements of the Institute from Financial Year 2014-15 and the guidelines given thereon have been complied with in the preparation of Financial Statements in the new format of accounts prescribed and approved by the Comptroller & Auditor General (CAG) of India vide their letter no: RC(AB)/Misc./Format of A/cs/04-31/2013 dt.10.04.2015.
- 1.3 Amounts have been rounded off to the nearest rupee and they have been represented in lakh rounded to two decimals in Balance Sheet, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account as per the instructions and accounting principles of guidelines of format of accounts approved by the CAG of India and they are rounded to the nearest rupee in the rest of schedules and notes.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 2.1 Tuition Fee collected from students is a composite one which comprises fee towards Tuition, Library, Course Material, Hostel Room Rent, Internet etc. and it is accounted on accrual basis. The Tuition Fee is treated as Internal Revenue Generation (IRG).
- 2.2 Interest income has been accounted on accrual basis.

3. FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- 3.1 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and commissioning.
- 3.2 Self-constructed assets are stated at directly relatable cost of construction of the assets.
- 3.3 Capital work in progress includes the cost of fixed assets under construction or that are not ready for their intended use. Capital advances are disclosed separately under current assets.
- 3.4 Fixed Assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets had been provided under Straight Line Method (SLM). From the Financial Year 2014-15 onwards, the following rates prescribed under the Revised format of Accounts of Central Educational Institutions (CEIs) approved by CAG of India have been adopted.

- 3.5 Depreciation is provided for the whole year irrespective of the date on which it is put to use
- 3.6 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Re.I/- in the Balance Sheet.
- 3.7 Assets whose individual value is equal to or less than Rs.2000/-(except library books) are treated as Small Value Assets (SVA) and they are depreciated 100% by keeping residual value of Re.1/-.

4. INTANGIBLE ASSETS

- 4.1 The software, e-databases, e-journals etc., bought for perpetual uses are classified as FA-Intangible Assets and they are amortized over 2.5 years.
- 4.2 The software, e-databases, e-journals etc., whose life is equal to or less than one year, are charged to revenue expenditure in the year of occurrence.

5. INVESTMENTS

Investments being short term in nature are valued at cost or market value, whichever is lower.



6. EARMARKED/ENDOWMENTFUNDS

- 6.1 Funds received from donors for specific purpose are termed as Earmarked/ Endowment funds. The funds received from donor are represented by Investments or Term Deposits or Bank Balances. Interest earned on such funds is utilized for specific purpose for which funds were obtained. Income and Expenses relating to Endowment funds are set off in the fund account in Balance Sheet and not taken to Income and Expenditure account.
- 6.2 Corpus fund: The Tuition Fee received from the students has been treated as the Internal Revenue Generation(IRG) of the Institute. The Board of Governors (BoG) has, vide item No.V.7 of the Minutes of 13th Meeting held on 10.01.2014, approved for the creation of Institute Corpus Fund. The Corpus Fund so created, is sourced by tuition fee, interest earned on tuition fee kept in fixed deposits and Institute's share of EEC programmes and it has been deposited in Long Term Deposits with Scheduled Banks as per the decision of Board.

7. GOVERNMENT GRANTS

- 7.1 The Grants received from Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) are accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of Grant pertaining to the financial year for which accounts are prepared is received before 31st March of the respective financial year and the grant is actually received in the subsequent financial year, the Grant is accounted on accrual basis.
- 7.2 The Grants are received from MHRD under three group heads, viz., GIA-35 (Creation of Capital Assets), GIA-31(General) and GIA-36(Salaries).
- 7.3 Out of the Capital Grant received, the amount incurred during the year towards capital expenditure is transferred to Capital Fund.
- 7.4 Grant received towards General and Salary expenditure, is treated as income to the extent expenditure has been incurred during the year. However, in view of the stoppage of revenue grant by MHRD for the FY 2018-19 the revenue expenditure has been met out from IRG.
- 7.5 Unutilized Grants (including advances paid out of grants) are carried forward and exhibited as current liability in the Balance Sheet.
- 7.6 The concept of "fund based accounting" has been complied with in the preparation of Financial Statements.
- 7.7 The Institute is funded by MHRD through Plan Grant only for meeting out capital expenditure in full and the revenue expenditure to the extent of available fund.

8. SPONSORED PROJECTS

In respect of ongoing Sponsored Projects, the amounts received from sponsors are credited to the head "Current Liabilities and Provisions" [Schedule 3(a)]. As and when expenditure incurred against such projects, the concerned project account is debited with allocated overhead charges.



9. EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

- 9.1 All the employees appointed since the inception of the institute are governed under National Pension System. The NPS is a defined contribution plan and contributions to the scheme are accounted on accrual basis.
- 9.2 Retirement benefits such as gratuity and leave encashment being defined benefit plan are provided on the basis of actuarial valuation in accordance with the provisions of AS15. Accordingly, for current FY2018-19, provision of Rs. 57,46,944/- has been made based on Actuarial Valuation.
- 9.3 Contribution to Provident Fund, which is a defined contribution plan, in accordance with the relevant statute is charged to Income and Expenditure account on accrual basis.
- 9.4 All other employee benefits are accounted as short term obligation on accrual basis.

10. INCOME TAX

The income of the Institute is exempt from Income Tax u/s IO (23C) (iiiab) of Income Tax Act, 1961.

11. PROVISIONS

A provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

12. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises due to past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the institute or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases where there is a liability that cannot be recognized because it cannot be measured reliably. There is no contingent liability as on March 31, 2019.

SCHEDULE 24 NOTES OF ACCOUNTS

1. CAPITAL COMMITMENT

1.1 The Government of Tamil Nadu have vide G.O. (Ms) No. 491, Higher Education Department, dated 22.12.2008 have issued order alienating land to an extent of 192.35 acres in Suriyur Village, Tiruchirappalli District situated within the Bharathidasan University (BDU) Campus to the Ministry of HRD, Department of Higher Education, Government of India, New Delhi, for the purpose of establishing Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli. The said land has been taken possession vide land transfer certificate effected by Thasildar of Tiruverumbur on 03.09.2010. The name transfer for the said land in the name of IIMT has been effected alongwith the patta in August 2010. As per the provisions of Section 17 (2) of the Registration Act, 1908, the registration is not required for any grant of immovable property by one Government to another Government.

However, the Government of Tamil Nadu (GoTN) have vide G.O. (Ms) No. 181 dated 10.08.2011 transferred land to an extent of 22.08 acres back to Bharathidasan University. The IIM Tiruchirappalli has taken up this issue with Chief Secretary and the District Collector of Tiruchirappalli to take back 22.08 acres of land. The MHRD has also been approached to resolve the issue. After holding several negotiations and correspondences with BDU and Principal Secretary, Dept. of Higher Education, GoTN a meeting was conducted among the Authorities of IIMT and BDU in presence of Principal Secretary, Dept.of Higher Education, GoTN on 8th April, 2014 and a MoU was reached between IIMT and BDU on 24.06.2014. The MoU, interalia, envisaged alienation of land measuring 3.60 acres (including the bore well) in SF No.656/2B and as a measure of Goodwill and compensation for the said portion of land along with borewell, IIMT would pay a sum of Rs.135.42 lakh to Tamil Nadu Water & Drainage Board (TWAD Board) towards the cost of executing the project for providing 2.00 lakh litres of water per day from Cauvery basin to BDU as full and final payment which has been effected during FY 2016-17. IIMT will not be liable for any recurring expenditure thereafter. As envisaged in MoU, GoTN have alienated the land measuring 3.60 acres to IIMT vide G.O. (Ms) No. 73 dt. 18.04.2017 of Higher Education (J2) Department, GoTN. Thus, the total area alienated by GoTN to IIMT is 173.87 acres as on 18.04.2017. No value towards the cost of land has been assigned as the land was transferred by the Government of Tamil Nadu free of cost.

In addition to the above, the estimated cost for providing water supply from Cauvery Basin to the New Campus of the Institute worked out to Rs.171.00 lakh (2012-13 Schedule of rates) which was again revised to Rs.192.68 lakh (July 2015) and subsequently further revised to Rs. 243.96 lakh (December 2016). The entire sum of Rs.243.96 lakh has been paid (Jan. 2017) to TWAD Board. The entire work was completed by TWAD Board and regular supply of Cauvery water has commenced w.e.f. 01.09.2018. However, the completion report comprising the actual cost of project is awaited from TWAD Board.

1.2 Administrative approval was accorded for the construction of New Campus amounting to Rs.332.72 Cr.. A sum of Rs. 324.16 Cr. was deposited with CPWD, IIMT Project Division, IIMT Project Circle, Trichy. In addition to this a sum of Rs.16.87 crore has been deposited with CPWD to carry out



certain additional works. Thus, the total amount of advance deposited with CPWD works out to Rs.341.03 Cr. till 31.03.2019. The value of work done as on 31.03.2019 is Rs.329.77 Cr. and out of which the value of the work completed as of 31.03.2019 was Rs.324.19 Cr.. The value of the completed work has been capitalized during the current year 2018-19 since they were completed during 2018-19 as per the details of building wise construction data furnished by CPWD. The completion report with final cost of work is still awaited from CPWD. The formal handing over report pertaining to all completed works are yet to be furnished by CPWD.

2. FIXED ASSETS

- 2.1 Additions in the year 2018-19 to Fixed Assets in Schedule 4 include Assets purchased out of Plan Funds amounting to Rs.28.40 Cr. The Assets have been set up by credit to Capital Fund. Assets to the tune of Rs.0.004 Cr. were also purchased for IIMT-CC as per Schedule 4E.
- 2.2 All the Fixed Assets of IIMT were acquired from Plan funds only right from the inception of the Institute to till date (31.03.2019).
- 2.3 No Fixed Asset has been purchased out of funds of Sponsored Projects as at the date of Balance Sheet.
- 2.4 A Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) has been executed on 16.01.2017 with Rural Electrification Corporation Limited (RECL), a leading public sector enterprise of Govt. of India under the administrative control of Ministry of Power for the installation of 2MW Solar Power Plant Project in IIMT Campus in accordance with RECL policy on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) aligned with Companies Act, 2013 wherein RECL has sanctioned financial contribution of Rs. 1420.00 lakh plus GST towards the cost of the project. As per the terms of MoA, IIMT has opened a separate bank account (No.37870956845) with SBI on 14.08.2018 and a sum of Rs.568.00 lakh being 40% of sanctioned amount has been received on 17.09.2018 towards 1st instalment. The interest earned and accrued in the said SB A/c. is Rs.4.57 lakh as on 31.03.2019.

The National Institute of Wind Energy (NIWE), an autonomous R&D Institution of Ministry of New & Renewable Energy (MNRE), Government of India has been appointed as implementing agency for setting up of 2MW Solar Power Plant Project on a single nomination basis under Rule 194 of GFR 2017 and a contract to that effect has been executed with NIWE on 14.08.2018. As per the terms of contract, a sum of Rs.540.00 lakh has been released to NIWE on 27.11.2018. In addition to this a sum of Rs.1.80 lakh has been spent by the Institute towards the Solar PPP. The work of Installing 2MW Solar Power Plant Project is in progress as of 31.03.2019.

3. ENDOWMENT FUND

The erstwhile Chairman of the Institute, Shri. M. Damodaran, IAS (Rtd.), proposed (Feb.2014) to institute an annual Award for the Outstanding Lady Student among the graduating students of the PGP every year in memory of his beloved mother, Late Ms.Leela Chandrasekhara Menon. The proposal was approved (Feb.2014) by the faculty council of the Institute and as per the approval of the BoG given vide item No.VI.3 of 14th Meeting held on 15.03.2014 in pursuance of the powers conferred on it under Rule 12(vii) of IIM Tiruchirappalli Society, an Endowment Fund in the name of "Leela Chandrasekhara Menon Award for the Outstanding Lady Student of the Year" has been created for which a sum of Rs.6.00 lakh has been



received (in Feb.2014) from the erstwhile Chairman of the Institute and it has been deposited (10.03.2014) for period of 10 years in PNB through a separate savings bank account No.0457000100136854 opened with PNB to operate and maintain the said Endowment Fund Account. Out of the interest proceeds received every year, a cash prize of Rs.50,000/- along with a certificate has been awarded to the outstanding lady student among the graduating lady students of the two years PGP every year from 2013-15 Batch onwards.

4. CURRENT ASSETS

- 4.1 The current assets, Loans, Advances and deposits have a value on realization in the ordinary course, equal at least to the aggregate amount shown in the balance sheet.
- 4.2 The details of balances in savings accounts and fixed deposit accounts with banks are given in Annexure A to Schedule 7 (Current Assets).

5. REGROUPING OF ACCOUNTS INCLUDING PREVIOUS YEAR AMOUNTS

Based on Uniform Accounting Standard issued by MHRD, the grants received have been classified as capital fund. Further, grants pending to be utilized as at the year end have been classified as unutilized grants.

6. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

There is no contingent liability as on March 31, 2019.

- 7. The National Pension System (NPS) Accounts are owned by the members of that fund and not by the Institution and all the transactions pertaining to NPS are routed through a separate bank account. A Receipts and Payments Account, Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet for NPS Account are attached to the Institution's Accounts. The contributions made by the Subscribers and the Institute were regularly remitted into NSDL -CRA A/c as per NPS instructions. The contributions relating to March 2019 are exhibited in the Current Liability of the Institute as the due date of payment falls in the first working day of April 2019.
- **8.** IIMT has not received grant from MHRD during the FY 2018-19. However, accounting of grants has been complied with as per UAS as mentioned vide Sl.No. 7 of Significant Accounting Policies (Schedule 23).

9. GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST) ACT, 2017

The Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 came into existence w.e.f. 01.07.2017. The GST Registration No. of the Institute is 33AAAAI5004R1ZO.

- **10.** During the current year, provision for gratuity and leave encashment amounting to Rs.57.47 lakh as per the actuarial valuation has been accounted for in the books of accounts for the FY 2018-19.
- 11. A sum of Rs.101.40 lakh has been provided towards Incentive for Faculty (Work Plan Norm) during the previous FY 2017-18 against which a sum of Rs.127.06 lakh has been paid and the difference of Rs.25.66 lakh has been treated as prior period expenses during the current FY 2018-19. Similarly, a sum of Rs.127.06 lakh has been provided for the current FY 2018-19.



- **12.** In respect of common pool expenditure towards admission for 2019-21 batch, no provision has been made since the details of total/average expenditure for each IIM have not been received from IIM Ranchi being the coordinating IIM for 2019-21 batch.
