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**Minutes of the 24<sup>th</sup> Project Approval Board (PAB) (4<sup>th</sup> Integrated RMSA) held on 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2013 to consider the Annual Work Plan & Budget 2013-14 of the state of Rajasthan**

The 24<sup>th</sup> meeting of the PAB (4<sup>th</sup> Integrated RMSA) for considering the Annual Work Plan & Budget 2013-14 for the states of Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan and Gujarat in respect of the Centrally Sponsored Schemes of Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA), ICT@ Schools (ICT), Girls' Hostels (GH), Inclusive Education for Disabled at Secondary Stage (IEDSS), Vocational Education (VE) was held on 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2013 under the Chairmanship of Shri. R. Bhattacharya, Secretary (SE&L).

2. The list of participants who attended the meeting is attached at **Annexure I**.

**Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA)**

3. At the outset, the Secretary (SE&L) welcomed the participants. He then proceeded to review the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) activities and progress of the States in relation to the Centrally Sponsored Schemes of National Means and Merit Scholarship (NMMS) and National Scheme of Incentive for Girls (NSIGSE). He also reviewed the status of Annual Plan Provisions of the States in respect of School Education.

4. Secretary (SE&L) informed the participants that in respect of the scheme RMSA, the Cabinet has favourably considered various long pending demands of the States/UTs such as adoption of State Schedule of Rates (SoR) in civil works, enhancement of percentage of Monitoring, Management, Evaluation and Research (MMER), continuance of the 75:25 sharing pattern between Centre and States and extension of quality related interventions of the scheme to Government aided schools. He also clarified that the revised norms relating to SoR and enhanced percentage of MMER, will be applicable prospectively.

5. Ms Caralyn K Deshmukh, Director (RMSA I) then presented the status of the state in the secondary education sector. A copy of presentation is at **Annexure II**.





### **Areas of concern:**

6. The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in secondary classes at state level is 73.51 but the GER in the districts of Jaisalmer (37.79) Barmer (52.30), Jalore (53.21) is quite low. Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) at 39.48 at the state level is very low, with Jaisalmer (16.97) and Barmer (19.26) requiring special attention. The GPI (0.77) is also lower than the National Average. Pupil Teacher Ratio (PTR) is as high as 100:1 in Jaipur, 50:1 in Pali and on the other hand Pupil Teacher Ratio (PTR) as low as 8:1 in Kota and 5:1 in Jaisalmer.

### **7. Issues:**

- The State Govt. has to revise the Audit Reports for 2009-10 and 2011-12 as per MHRD observation while had been communicated to the state.
- The State also needs to revise the Utilization Certificate (UC) for 2010-11 in respect of RMSA in the light of observations made and also to send the UC for 2011-12 for RMSA and also for Girls Hostel Scheme.
- The State has to refund Rs. 184.44 lakh unspent balance lying against releases for preparatory activities or this amount may be adjusted against the recurring releases.
- The state has not made much progress in teacher recruitment.

### **Special Focus Districts (SFD) and Convergence:**

8. There are 186 Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) spread over 33 districts. There are 6 Special Focus Districts (SFDs) out of which 2 are SC concentrated district and 4 are ST concentrated districts. Previously 622 schools in SFDs were approved under strengthening head. In the current year, out of total 216 schools proposed, 45 school fall under SFDs area/districts.

### **Progress under RMSA:**

9. **Recurring:** The progress made by the state in respect of recurring activities is low. In the last financial year 2012-13, a total outlay of Rs. 25727.97 lakh was approved for the State under the recurring head with a central share of Rs. 19296 lakh, out of which Rs. 8703.95 lakh was released (after adjusting the unspent available funds of Rs. 2873.65 lakh.) The State Govt. had incurred expenditure of Rs. 5793 lakhs i.e., 20.98% expenditure out of the available fund. However, 100% expenditure on Minor Repair, Teacher Training and exposure visit of students was incurred. More than 95% expenditure had been incurred on School Grant & SMDC training

and 43% for study tour of students outside the state, while no expenditure had been incurred on salary of additional teachers approved in 2011-12 as no teachers were recruited.

10. **Non Recurring:** 4335 schools were approved for strengthening of these schools under civil works. The performance of the State in civil works is not very encouraging with completion of work of only 28% against the approvals of 2010-11 and work still to start with respect to the approvals of 2011-12. The State Govt. has clarified that the funds were released towards the end of 2010-11 and State has completed the tendering process in 2011-12, field staff has been recruited, and the work has now started.

11. The State govt. has requested for additional funds for the civil works approved under the fixed norms of RMSA earlier. However, it was clarified that no additional ( extra) funds can be released to states in respect of old approvals and the SSoR or CPWD rates are applicable only prospectively , i.e, from this year onwards. The State needs to leverage funds from other sources to complete the civil works approvals accorded earlier.

12. Since the State Secretary was not present in the meeting, a number of issues raised could not be discussed. The Secretary (SE&L) directed that another meeting with the State would need to be held in order to clarify these issues. Subsequently, another meeting was held with the Principal Secretary at the Joint Secretary level.

#### **Annual Work Plan and Budget of 2013-14:**

13. Thereafter, the intervention-wise discussion was held and the following decisions were taken:

S. No.	Activities
<b>Non-Recurring</b>	
<b>1.</b>	<b>Up gradation of new schools:</b>
1.1	The State has proposed for 226 (one section) new secondary schools for upgrading in 2013-14. In view of the fact that the State Govt. has already notified opening of these schools, <u>no new schools upgradation was approved.</u>





<b>2.</b>	<b>Strengthening of existing Govt. schools:</b>
2.1	The State Government proposed for strengthening of 514 existing secondary schools - in which 355 schools were found eligible according to RMSA norms. In these 355 schools, the components eligible are 741 additional classroom, 274 science lab, 274 lab equipment, 189 computer room, 200 library & 272 art/craft/culture room, but due to the huge backlog of civil works approved previously, it has been decided by the PAB that the State may first complete civil works of earlier approvals and inform MHRD about completion of at least 50% works by the month of December 2013, after which, strengthening works appraised may be considered for approval.
2.2	The state had not proposed for new toilets blocks and drinking water – and it has committed that this component in school is being constructed through other schemes. The State is requested to inform MHRD of the compliance to ensure adequate separate toilets for girls and boys and of the steps taken to leverage other schemes' funds.
<b>Recurring</b>	
<b>3.</b>	<b>Staff for new schools:</b>
3.1	Since no new schools were approved, therefore no new teachers (including Head Masters), Lab Attendant, Office Assistant posts were considered.
<b>4.</b>	<b>Salary for teachers sanctioned</b>
4.1	With regard to the salary of the 8098 additional teacher approved previously, the state was asked to send documentary evidence of the teachers recruited after which funds will be released. However, a notional salary for one month will be made.
<b>5.</b>	<b>School Grant:</b>
5.1	Against the proposal of 11805 schools, the school grant for 11781 existing schools was approved restricting the grant to functional schools as per UDISE.
<b>6.</b>	<b>Minor Repair:</b>
6.1	Against the request of State for minor repair grant to 11697 schools, 11304 schools having their own building as per UDISE was considered and approved.
<b>7.</b>	<b>Teachers' Training</b>
<b>7.1</b>	<b>Training of Head Masters</b>
7.1.1	As against the proposal of 11805 Head Masters (HMs), the approval is restricted to the training of 7259 HMs, restricted as per U-DISE data.

7.1.2	The proposal of 14 days Leadership training for selected Principals separately has not been approved because this activity is being carried out in collaboration with NUEPA as approved by the PAB for this year
7.1.3	The proposal of the state for a 10 day training for 2100 newly recruited Head Masters was approved as proposed.
<b>7.2</b>	<b>In service training of existing teachers</b>
7.2.1	A 5-day in service training/ need-based workshop for English, Maths, Science, Social Services to 8000 Teachers was approved as against the proposed 9304 teachers.  The proposal for a 7 - day Yoga training for 25% of existing PETs was suggested to be included as part of In-service training. Therefore no separate funding will be given for this activity.
7.2.2	A 10 - day induction training for newly recruited 10000 teachers was approved as proposed in the AWP&B.
<b>7.3</b>	<b>Training of Master Resource Persons</b>
7.3.1	The proposal for 10 Days Module Development Workshop for teacher training was approved. A suggestion was made that the activity may be coordinated with NCERTs efforts.
7.3.2	A 5-Days training of Master Resource Persons for 396 Teachers was approved against 1000 teachers proposed by State Govt.. The State may take up the activity through NCERT.
7.3.3	The proposal for 3 days training for master trainers for HMs was not approved It was suggested to make it part of the HMs training approved above at 8.1.1.
7.3.4	The proposal for providing study material to training participants of in-service training and induction training as well as training of new HMs was not approved. This should be part of the training costs as at 8.2.1 and 8.2.2.
7.3.5	The proposal regarding Learning Level assessment of Class IX students is actually a proposal to develop question papers in core subjects rather than development of standard framework for learning indicators. The Learning Level Assessment Programme proposed is actually an exercise for developing a common question paper/ question bank for core subjects which can be done and should be done by teachers themselves. More innovative thinking and attempt to analyze students learning levels- learning needs- by developing a standard of learning achievements



	<p>and tools / indicators for this.</p> <p>Moreover assessing learning needs of the students should be a part of classroom process. Teachers should possess the competency to identify learning needs of the students. Teachers may make use of various group exercises, role -plays, quiz, extempore speeches, class interaction, etc. to assess learning needs of the students. CBSE has developed such type of manuals in core subjects, which can be used by the state. The same has been advised to states like Uttarakhand &amp; Manipur.</p>
7.3.6	The proposal of state level workshops on different issues was not agreed to as the details have not been given.
7.3.7	The school leadership programme for training proposal for leadership programme through NCSL -NUEPA and UKEIRI which consists of- (1) Field workshop at Jaipur (2) 5 days training programme including to 40 lead trainers and facilitators (3) Conference of the Induction Programme for School Principals in Rajasthan (4) Three Day Cluster Based Capacity Building of Heads of Schools in Rajasthan - was approved for an amount of Rs. 68 lakhs.
8.0	<b>Quality Interventions:</b>
8.0.1	The State was advised to take up the proposed for excursion trip for students as a local initiative. Accordingly, the interventions i.e., Excursion trip to students within the state, Study tours for students outside the state; Excursion trip for Teachers within the State, Study tour for Teachers outside the state were not approved by the PAB.
8.1	<b>Hub for EDUSAT</b>
8.1.1	The proposal of Establishment of ROT's in one school per block; and maintenance cost for existing RoT's, content development was not approved.
8.1.2	The proposal for supply of sports equipments for 69 schools @ 2-5 schools per district was approved @ Rs 20,000 per school.
8.1.3	The proposal for training for Civil & Accounts wing, and orientation of district/state staff was not approved and it is suggested that the same may be met from MMER funds.
9.	<b>Guidance &amp; Counseling</b>
9.1	The proposal for Honorarium for 5 State level coordinators and 33 Research Assistants was approved. However, actual release of funds is subject to receiving of formal confirmation from the State Govt. with respect to their positioning in place.

9.2	The proposal for strengthening of guidance and counseling curriculum was not approved. However, development of literature and display material for the cell was approved @ Rs. 50,000.
10	<b>Equity Interventions</b>
10.1	<b>Girls oriented activities</b>
10.1.1	The proposal for providing self-defense training to 372 girls was approved as proposed by State.
10.1.2	Excursion tours for the girls of Girls Hostels to outside the State was not considered for the reasons mentioned above.
10.1.3	The proposed 5- Day training for personality development and life skills, it was not approved, since the State is already organizing camps with the help of UNICEF and UNFPA.
10.2	<b>SC/ST oriented activities</b>
10.2.1	The proposal of attendance based incentives (dictionary, books etc) to the SC/ST girls was not approved.
10.2.2	The proposal of remedial teaching for 554 girls (20% of SC/ST girls) residing in the functional girls hostel was approved as per norms.
10.3	<b>Educational Backward Minorities oriented activities</b>
10.3.1	The proposal of enrolment drive at EBB HQ & in city/ municipal area for minority girls was approved.
10.3.2	The proposal of Attendance based incentives (dictionary / books) to minority girls was not approved as RMSA does not have norms for initiatives for individual incentives.
10.3.3	The proposal of Remedial Teaching for 2070 Minority girls was agreed but limited to 20% of weakest students in the minorities girls (2070) @ Rs. 500 per child.
11	<b>Interventions for Out of school children</b>
11.1	The proposals of enrolment drive for out of school children was not approved as guidelines for open schooling system are under process.
12.	<b>Any other activity</b>
12.1	The proposal of exposure visit of state / district officials was not approved. It was suggested that this may be carried out from MMER.



12.2	The proposal of one-day legal and literacy training for Mahila Prakosht in-charge of every Government school; provision of a Helpbook & Information Guide for teachers; were not approved as no details were provided.
<b>13</b>	<b>Community training:</b>
13.1	The proposal of the State to organize training of 13712 SMDC members was agreed by PAB as per UDISE data on the condition that the convergence between the SMC and the SMDC should be brought out and state Govt. shall provide the progress report on the SMDC training programmes.
14	<b>MMER:</b> 3.5% of the approved outlay.

14. The cost sheet indicating the component wise proposal and approval for RMSA is at Annexure-III.

#### ICT @ School Scheme

15. Under ICT @ schools scheme, PAB was informed that 6600 schools have been covered, however, there is UDISE code discrepancy/ difference in respect of 3 schools .

16. The State Government requested for time to examine and sort out the discrepancy in the UDISE Code of the schools. However, if the state is not able to clarify the discrepancy, the funds released for 3 schools may have to be refunded by the state or deducted from later releases.

17. The proposal of State Government to cover 2000 new schools and 7 Smart Schools was not agreed to as the State Government is still to implement the scheme in respect of 4000 schools approved previously.

## EDSS Scheme

### **Non-recurring Grant**

18. State Govt. had proposed for a non-recurring grant of Rs.1339.86 lakhs, of which Rs. 70.00 lakhs was proposed for equipments and for construction of 100 resource rooms, Rs. 763.86 lakhs for removal of architectural barriers in 1740 schools, Rs. 496.00 lakhs for construction of 992 new toilets for CWSN and Rs. 10.00 lakhs for distribution of 500 Aids & Appliances.

19. The State has not furnished the details of resource rooms and schools where the above activities were proposed to be undertaken. Costing details for new toilets were also not provided. Under architectural barrier removal, the State has already received sanction for 3311 schools.. **The proposal was, therefore, not approved by PAB.**

### **Recurring**

20. The State submitted the proposal for a recurring grant of Rs.248.91 lacs. PAB **approved** a recurring grant of Rs.147.81 lakhs including MMER as under:

- Rs.12.96 lakhs as 12 months salary for two Special Education Teachers sanctioned in previous years subject to State Government furnishing the details of these teachers, including the date of their joining, recruitment policy of the State and salary structure of teachers, etc.;
- Rs. 91.62 lakhs for student oriented components;
- Rs.1.49 lakhs for in-service training for existing 99 teachers @ Rs.1500 per teacher (Rs.300/day for 5 days for 3 teachers per district);
- Rs.9.90 lakhs for orientation of 1650 Principals, Educational administrators, parents/guardians, etc @ Rs.600/person.;
- Rs.24.80 lakhs for Environment Building Programme in 248 blocks @ Rs.10,000/- per block.

21. Component-wise break up of approved recurring grant is **at Annexure IV.**

## Girls' Hostel Scheme

### **Non-recurring**

22. State had proposed for :

- i) Grant of additional funds for carrying out additional construction in the hostel buildings which had either been completed (80) or under construction (69), as per revised space norms of the scheme based on State SORs ; and



- ii) Fresh sanction of funds as per revised space norms for 37 hostels where the construction had not started on State SOR basis.

23. Secretary (SE&L) enquired whether PAB was competent to sanction additional funds in respect of hostels already sanctioned on pre-revised fixed unit cost of Rs.42.50 lakh. He was informed that the present cost norms based on State Schedule of Rates for construction of hostels, revised in June 2011, were applicable to the hostels already sanctioned in 2009-10 and 2010-11 also. JS (SE.I) informed the State that additional funds would not be given for hostels which had been completed and functioning since 2011-12.

24. While seeking additional funds, State was required to furnish the building design depicting the portion already under construction and the additional part proposed to be constructed as per revised space norms and accordingly cost estimates for additional part. State was also required to furnish fresh building design for 37 hostels where the construction had not started along with other relevant documents. State informed that separate proposal for 37 hostels would be submitted within a week. Secretary (SE&L) asked JS(SE.I) to take up the proposal separately. As such a post-PAB meeting was held in the room of JS(SE.I) on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2013 with State representatives wherein JS(SE.I) asked the State to justify as to why those 37 hostels could not be constructed along with others at pre-revised unit cost of Rs.42.50 lacs. State representative clarified that tenders for these hostels were also floated twice or thrice along with other hostels but there were no takers for these hostels at that rate. JS(SE.I) asked the State to submit the proposal for these 37 hostels separately along with the justification for sanctioning them at State SORs within a week's time from that date. JS(SE.I) also stated that the proposal would be processed separately with the concurrence of IFD.

#### Recurring Grant

25. State had also proposed for recurring grant of Rs.2134.28 lacs for 124 hostels for 2013-14. JS(SE.I) enquired whether these hostels were complete and starting functioning to which the State replied that 66 hostels were already functioning since 2011-12 and recurring grant was also being given for them. Construction of 58 hostels would be completed very soon and State proposed to make them functional from this session only. **PAB approved recurring grant of Rs.528.94 lakh including MMER of Rs. 12.90 lakh for 2768 inmates in 66 hostels already**

functioning from 2011-12. PAB also **approved recurring grant for 58 hostels** for 2013-14 but decided that the funds would be released only after receipt of confirmation from the State that the hostels are complete and fit to be made functional and the staff is in position including the no. of inmates in each hostel.

26. Break-up of recurring grant approved for 66 hostels is **at Annexure V**.

**Vocational Education scheme:-**

27. Under Vocational education scheme, no proposal was submitted by the state.

**Fresh Total Financial Approval For 2013-14:-**

28. Based on above the approvals accorded for various interventions in respect of all 5 Schemes, the non-recurring interventions amounting to Rs 12459.01 lakh and recurring interventions amounting to Rs. 13083.05 lakh with the Central Share amounting to Rs. 19272.76 lakhs and State share of Rs. 6269.19 lakh have been approved. The MMER in respect of all these Schemes for the approved interventions will come to Rs. 860.37 lakh. The Scheme-wise depiction of the proposals of the State and approvals accorded by PAB in financial term is capitulated in the following table:

29. The release of funds to different schemes will be further guided by the following conditions:

- (i) The State Administration shall give a written commitment for meeting its share of the RMSA, ICT@ School, IEDSS, Girls Hostel & Vocational Education of the budget approved according to prescribed sharing pattern of the schemes.
- (ii) SMDCs or equivalent bodies should be constituted and accounts opened to incur expenditure under school grant, minor repair, civil works, and other such expenditures, which have to be incurred only through these bodies as per RMSA norms.
- (iii) The State Government will maintain their level of investment in Secondary education as in 2009-2010 and give the details of this to GOI before the release of second instalment. The contribution as UT share for RMSA will be over and above this investment.
- (iv) The second instalment would only be released after (a) the proportionate instalment of State share has been transferred to the State Implementation Society, (b) at least 50% expenditure against available funds has been incurred, (c) utilization certificate has been submitted for funds released in the year 2012-13 and (d) Audit Reports have been submitted for the year 2011-12.

30. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

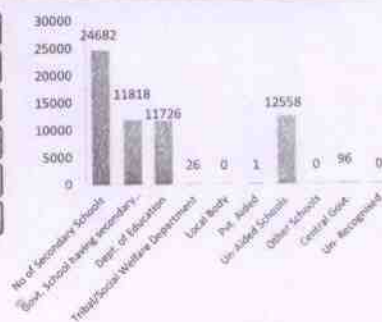

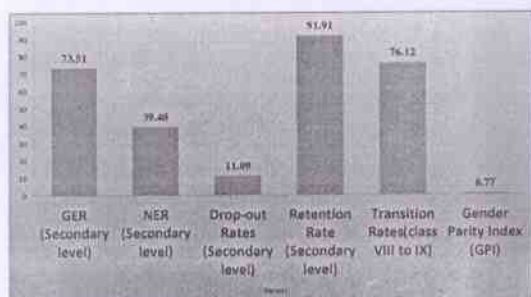

- 5000 and more schools opened since 2009-10.
- 98 % teachers are trained.
- Convergence shown with the Rajasthan knowledge corporation limited for basic computer learning and with other government department for toilet and Drinking water facility.
- Several programmes like Transport Voucher Scheme, Ladies Bicycle Scheme, Free Computer Education Scheme, Aspi Beti Scheme, Gargi Awards, Motivation Camps at Gram Panchayat Level, Free residential facilities for tribal girls, are being initiated by the state.
- Education expenditure increased from Rs. 1110 crore (2002-03) to Rs.2915 crore (year 2012-13). This indicated staggering increase of more than 100% . Expenditure on girls education also gets a proportionate increase (AWP&B Pg 289)

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## Major Issue (Contd.)

☞ **Adverse GPI:** The total state GPI is 0.77, which is lower than the national GPI of 0.88. Alarming, Jaisalmer (0.40), Jalore (0.47) and Sirohi (0.50) are amongst the districts with lowest in adverse GPI, which ranges between 40-51.

☞ **Gender Gap:-** The state gender gap stands at 30.03 and it is at its peak in Jaisalmer at 68.38, followed by Jalore at 55.75 and needs attention.

## Major Issue

❖ **Financial issues :-** State has not adjusted advance since 2009 as reported in the audit reports resulted a huge balance.

❖ **Audit report:** State has reported that advance incurred since 2009-10 to 2011-12 has been utilized. However, the Audit reports submitted by state are not showing any adjusted advance.

❖ **Utilization certification:-** Utilization Certificates for 2010-11 includes RMSA, Model Schools & Girls Hostel which needs to be revised (already sent a letter) 2011-12 is yet to be received.

❖ **Unspent fund:-** No fund has been utilized for Non- recurring grant up to 2011-12. However, only 52.08% out of total available fund is reported in 2013-14.

## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ Pass Percentage of Students:

The pass percentage - 62%.

☞ This reveals that 38% of the students could not pass out the secondary examination.

## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ PTR and Rationalization of Teachers:

❖ The PTR is as high as 100:1 in Jaipur, 50:1 in Pali, 41:1 in Sikar and 32:1 in Dugarpur, which is above the national average of 30:1 as envisioned under RMSA.

☞ On the other hand, there are districts like Kota, which has a PTR of 8:1 and Jaisalmer, which has a PTR of 5:1.

◆ The teachers are recruited at the state level, which means they can be transferred; anywhere in the state since the PTR is 18:1 at the state level and therefore there is urgent need of rationalization of teachers across the state to equalize the PTR in 33 districts.

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## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ Adaptation of NCF 2005:

☞ NCERT has observed that Rajasthan has adopted NCERT's textbooks for classes IX-XII. However, during capacity building programmes of Master Trainers from Rajasthan, it was found that Master Trainers were not adequately aware of NCF-2005 perspectives on curriculum and pedagogy.

◆ Therefore, It is suggested that state may involve Regional Institute of Education, Ajmer in the planning and conduct of all kinds of teacher/head teacher training.

## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ Teacher Training vis-à-vis Recruitment:

In Rajasthan 50% secondary school teachers come through promotion from upper primary school teacher and 50% teachers are recruited through 'Rajasthan Public Service Commission'. Now teachers come through two different processes. Therefore, accordingly needs to formulate in-service.

☞ The Teacher Training needs to be aligned to the recruitment process, which is not existent at the moment.



## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ Teacher Training Plan:

☞ Plan for Teacher Training, Head Master Training & Induction Training is inadequate since no Need Based Assessment for Teacher Training has been done and therefore the hardsopts and the pedagogical method to be addressed in the current year is missing.

◆ There needs to be a overarching strategy for Teacher Training that the state needs to provide and the current years plan that will fit into the strategy. The outputs for this year's plan and the outcome of the overall strategy need to be mentioned.

## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ SMDC Training:

☞ The SMDC Training aims to target two members of the committee in the current year. The management committee is instrumental in developing the micro-plans for the states. If the state only targets Principals/Teachers without involving the community members particularly parents, members from the women's organizations, the issues that reflect the aspiration of the community from the schools will have been neglected.

◆ Therefore the state would require making very clear plan for the SMDC Training with specific outputs and target group. An overarching training plan that reflects the perspective of the state on SMDC planning needs to be provided along with current year's plan.

## Major Issue (Contd.)

❖ Vocational education:-Vocational Education scheme is not being implemented in the state of Rajasthan

❖ In General: Lack of school infrastructure, socio-economic problems of the community like early child marriage, attitude of the parents towards education, inadequacy of teachers in schools, students' disinterest in schooling are some of the main problems which obstruct learning in schools.

## Major Issue (Contd.)

## ❖ Regarding plan proposal:

The Appraisal Team acknowledges considerable improvement in the planning process compared to the last year's plan. Despite this, however, there is scope for improvement.

As per discussion during the Pre PAB meeting, there are very little details of strategies and practically no analysis. Sufficient detailing has not been done on interventions and strategies like Mahila Prakoshta, Guidance Cell etc.

The plan is input oriented and has not defined output and means of verification and indicators for these outputs in the plan. There is no means of verifying what will be the result of any of the activities after a year.



**Proposal :-** Under Girls' Hostel scheme the State has proposed under non recurring component :-

A. To have the additional resource for expansion as per the revised scheme of GOI & that too for 149 Girls Hostel in which either the construction has been completed or are in progress.

B. The state has also proposed the fresh resource sanction as per the revised scheme for 37 Girls Hostel in which there is no progress viz. not started schemes in the current year viz. 2013-14.

**Consideration for Girls hostel proposal :**

- Regarding the first case in which the Girls Hostel constructions are either completed or in-progress the state should show the already part under construction & the additional part to be constructed as per revised scheme norms and accordingly estimation about the additional part should be given.
- For 37 non started GH constructions the state is required to submit the fresh proposal as per the revised scheme.
- For both above cases the state is required to submit the details as per the letter of the Ministry vide D.O. No. 3-2/2010-Desk(GH)/Vol. II dt. June 12, 2012. So, the state may be requested to come-back with this proposal in the next financial year's plan along with the requisite details or the PAB may consider to give some time slot to the state for submission of the requisite details.

- Consideration for Girls' Hostel Recurring :-**

Recurring components for 66 Girls Hostel (Completed construction & Functional) has been recommended for 12 months for salary of Staff (in place), Maintenance & Miscellaneous and 10 months for student oriented activities as per data provided (for 2768 students) by the state. In principal recurring components are considered for 14 Girls hostels which are going to be functional by 1st July'13.

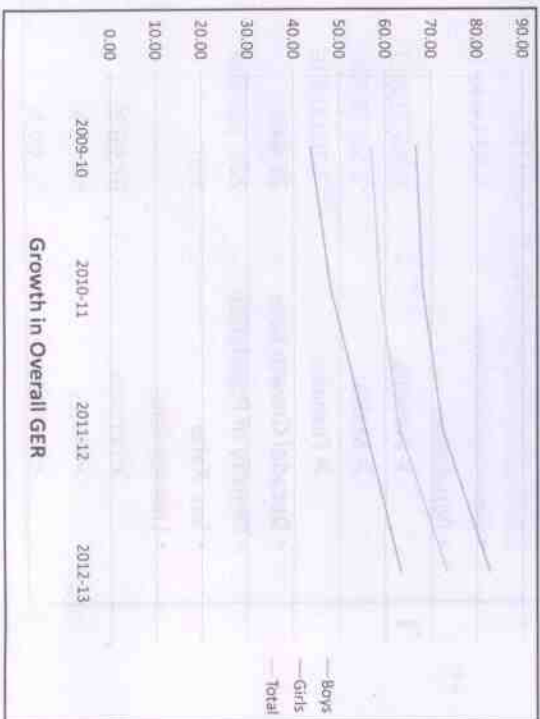

### Growth of Literacy Rates (in %)

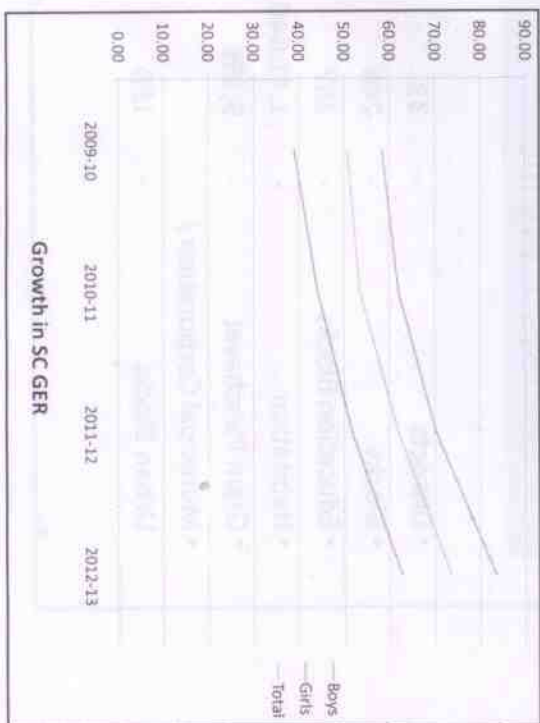
