#### Intervention

### Impact

 Quality Teacher Professional Development Program

- Engaged Private Training Colleges to offer their venues for conducting training of government teachers
- Mobilized various Non-governmental organization to provide Trainers at state and district level
- Robust monitoring and feedback mechanism
  to ensure quality training

- 80 (TEIs) teachers training institute are residential trainingready and 100% teachers will be trained in AY 2023-24
- 14,000 teachers are being trained per day
- Training on "Buniyaad" started for 4.35 lakh teachers

- Teacher Absenteeism
- App based Teacher Attendance through e-Shikshakosh by using geo-fencing technology
- Daily in-person inspection of 20,000 schools
- There is a significant reduction in teacher absenteeism

• Teachers

- Recruitment of 1.7 lakh teachers through public service commission
- At the end of the recruitment process, all schools will have adequate number of qualified teachers

### Intervention

- Participation of girls in secondary and Higher secondary Education
- Rs. 10,000 to all girls passing Secondary Examination with first division. Total budget used is 1,105 crore
- Rs. 25,000 to all unmarried girls passing Senior Secondary Examination and enrolled in Graduation. Total budget used is 405 crore
- Rs. 50,000 to all girls passing Graduation. Total budget is 134 crore
- Mukhyamantri Cycle Yojna Total 910547 girls paid money to buy cycles to commute to school. Total budget used is 266 crore
- Rs. 300 transferred to all girls from class 7 to 12 to buy Napkin for Menstrual Hygiene. Total budget used is 63 crore
- 243 sanitary napkin vending machine and incinerator installed in schools and 1048 machines are targeted in AY 2023-24
- 98% schools have girls' toilets in its premises
- Onsite monitoring of KGBV schools

#### Impact

- 6,43,633 girl students passed class 10<sup>th</sup> exam
- The number of girls passing 12<sup>th</sup> board has significantly increased from 2.0 lakh to 5.4 lakh in last 6 years.
- 61, 378 girls enrollment in 634 KGBV schools

#### Intervention

### Impact

 As the occurrence of school dropouts remains a prevalent phenomenon during early school days, a three months play-based program "Chahak" was launched for students of class 1

Issue

School Dropouts

- "Chahak" Workbooks was provided to all students of Class 1
- 5-days training was provided to teachers for conducting "Chahak"
- Enrollment Drive Praveshotsav organized to increase enrollment.
- 1,068 UIDAI centres established for enrollment.
- Free Uniform to ALL STUDENTS with a top-up
- Free textbooks to ALL STUDENTS. Total Budget used is
   446 crore

- Retention of 100% students in Class 1.
- 2.13 Crore (approx.) students enrolled in schools.
- 1 crore 48 lakh+ students received uniform.

#### Intervention

• Summer Camp with middle school students

- Non-residential Special Training for Out of School Students
- Engagement of Tola Sevak and Talimi Markaz from communities to positively influence enrollments of children from SC, ST, Backward Classes and Economically Backward Classes.
- Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Residential Hostels.

- 1.04 lakh Summer Camps held benefitting 12.46 lakh Children
- 24,608 students is going through special training to achieve age-appropriate competencies
- Total 18,463 Tola Sevak and 8,098 Talimi Markaz are working in communities
- 1,400 Boys and 100 girls are enrolled in 15 Netaji

 Participation of Parents and Community in School Education

#### Intervention

### • A mega PTM was organised for parents of Grade 1 students in October 2022.

- Invitation to parents through handmade cards prepared by the school students
- Home visit by Teachers and Bal Samsad members to invite parents
- 15 Lakh IVRS Calls made to parents
- Video messages from Senior Officials on Social Media
- Posters and Graphics inviting parents to the PTM
- PTM got institutionalized and organized for all grades from Grade 1 to 8 between October 2022 to March 2023.

#### The Mega PTM saw participation of over 14 lakh parents.

- Around 50 lakh parents turned up in the PTM across all primary Grades
- Huge participation of Women parents
- PTM for primary grades institutionalized and Annual PTM Calendar published

 Participation of CWSN students in the mainstream

#### Intervention

- A special drive was undertaken to identify children with special needs
- 90 days residential bridge course specifically designed for visually impaired boys
- Special Drive to include visually challenged girls in mainstream
- Special Drive to include girls with hearing impairment in mainstream
- Unique Disability Identity Card (UDID) being prepared in convergence with Department of Health and Department of Social welfare.

## Total 2 lakh CWSN students are identified

- 37,048 students were identified and granted certificates through special Drive in 2023-24
- 1,019 boys went through the bridge course
- Admission of 535 visually challenged girls in KGBV
- Admission of 1,916 girls in KGBV
   having hearing impairment

#### Intervention

Career
 Perspective
 issues

- Online Portal for Career Guidance has been developed
- On request from students, and teachers, Offline Career Cards were also launched
- Vocational course was introduced in one school per district across 33 districts, offering a selection of five trades. Each school focuses on two trades
- Additional 135 schools are set for vocational courses.
- Financial Literacy program in 13 Minority Populated Districts
- Self Esteem based Life Skill program in 13 Marginalized Districts
- 11,506+ teachers trained on self–esteem-based life skills program

- Approx. 21 lakh students used the portal till now
- 500 career cards in 21 career domains are developed and made available to schools for easy access
- 1,650 students are currently enrolled in the vocational course
- 6,750 more students are being added as beneficiaries of vocational course.
- 26,000 girls in 650 schools across
   13 districts gone through the Financial Literacy program
- 21 lakh Adolescence students undergone the self-esteem-based life skill program

 Motivation for extra-curricular activities

#### Intervention

- 3-days State Level Tarang Medha Utsav was organized in 2022.
- A series of competition events were organized for students of class 6 to 12 across six diverse domains, namely Painting, General Knowledge Quiz, Crossword, Hindi Essay Writing, Extempore, and Spelling Bee.
- 4-day state level Tarang Medha Sports Utsav was organized in 2023 with the objective of identifying Youth players from schools and train them for National level.
- Total 12 types of sports were part of the Tarang Medha Sports Utsav

#### Impact

• 432 students (211 girls and 221 boys) was felicitated at state level Tarang Medha Utsav.

 1224 students (612 girls and 612 boys) was felicitated at state level Tarang Medha Sports Utsav.
