OFFICE MEMORANDUM

2) O.M. No.36033/1/2013-Estt.(Res.) dated 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 Department of Personnel & Training.

Attention is invited to O.M. No. 36012/22/93-Estt.(SCT) dated 8<sup>th</sup> September, 1993 of DoPT which, inter-alia, provided that sons and daughters of persons having gross annual income of Rs.1 lakh or above for a period of three consecutive years would fall within the creamy layer and would not be entitled to get the benefit of reservation available to the Other Backward Classes. The aforesaid limit of income for determining the creamy layer status was subsequently raised to Rs. 2.5 lakh, Rs.4.5 lakh and Rs.6 lakh vide DoPT's O.M. No.36033/3/2004-Estt.(Res.) dated 09.03.2004, OM No. 36033/3/2004-Estt.(Res.) dated 14.10.2008 and OM No.36033/1/2013-Estt.(Res.) dated 27.05.2013 respectively. Vide O.M. No.11-13/2012-U.Policy dated 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2013 of Ministry of Human Resource Development, the Central Government specified that as per the above-mentioned DoPT O.M. dated 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2013 the income limit for determining the "creamy layer" among OBCs shall be Rs.6 lakh for reservation in admissions to Central Educational Institutions.

2. The DoPT, vide OM No.36033/1/2013-Estt.(Res.) dated 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 has now notified the revised limit of income for determining 'Creamy layer' status amongst the OBCs which is raised from the existing Rs.6 lakh to Rs.8 lakh per annum with effect from 1.9.2017. DoPT's OM dated 13.9.17 is attached for ready reference.

3. Accordingly, with the approval of the competent authority, the revised expression of "Rs. 8 lakh" under Category VI in the Schedule to the OM dt.8/9/1993 of DoPT shall be the limit of income, with effect from 01<sup>st</sup> September, 2017, for

determining 'creamy layer' status amongst the OBCs for reservation in admissions to Central Educational Institutions.

4. The provisions of this OM are in supersession of this Department's OM No.11-13/2012-U.Policy dated 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2013.


Subject: Revision of income criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from the purview of reservation for Other Backward Classes (OBCs)-reg.

The undersigned is directed to invite attention to this Department's Office Memorandum No. 36012/22/93-Estt. (SCT) dated 8<sup>th</sup> September, 1993 which, inter-alia, provided that sons and daughters of persons having gross annual income of ₹ 1 lakh or above for a period of three consecutive years would fall within the creamy layer and would not be entitled to get the benefit of reservation available to the Other Backward Classes. The aforesaid limit of income for determining the creamy layer status was subsequently raised to ₹ 2.5 lakh, ₹ 4.5 lakh and ₹ 6 lakh vide this Department's OM No. 36033/3/2004-Estt. (Res.) dated 09.03.2004, OM No. 36033/3/2004-Estt. (Res.) dated 14.10.2008 and OM No. 36033/1/2013-Estt. (Res.) dated 27.05.2013 respectively.

2. It has now been decided to raise the income limit from ₹ 6 lakh to ₹ 8 lakh per annum for determining the creamy layer amongst the Other Backward Classes. Accordingly, the expression "₹ 6 lakh" under Category VI in the Schedule to this Department's aforesaid O.M. dated 8<sup>th</sup> September, 1993 would be substituted by "₹ 8 lakh".

3. The provisions of this office memorandum have effect from 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2017.

4. All the Ministries/Departments are requested to bring the contents of this office memorandum to the notice of all concerned.


