



The Tenth meeting of the Project Approval Board (PAB) of the Scheme Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) was held at 10:00 AM on Wednesday, the 20th December, 2017 at MHRD Conference Room No. 112-C, Shastri Bhawan. Summary record of discussions of the Tenth Project Approval Board (PAB) Meeting of the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT) held on 20th December, 2017

The Tenth Project Approval Board (PAB) Meeting of the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT) was held on Wednesday, 20th December, 2017 at 10.00 AM. The meeting was chaired by Shri K. K. Sharma Secretary (HE) and Shri Anil Swarup Secretary (SE&L). The list of members is at **Annexure I**.

2. The agenda items taken up for discussion are as follows:

- i. Confirmation of minutes of the 9th PAB Meeting held on 12th July, 2017
- ii. Examination of 23 proposals received under various components of PMMMNTT Scheme.
- iii. Implementation of GoS recommendations for
 - a) Mandatory Induction Training programmes of newly recruited faculty in higher education and
 - b) Academic Leadership Development programme for senior academic and administrative functionaries (VC/*Registrar*/Dean/Heads) of higher / secondary education institutions.
- iv. Equivalence of UGC Career Advancement Scheme for orientation/refresher/API scores.
- v. Issues of on boarding of institutions on PFMS portal.
- vi. Update of EFC for continuation of schemes and follow up on issues (modification in Guidelines)
- vii. Any other matter with the permission of the Chair

3. Dr. N. Saravana Kumar, Joint Secretary (Policy) welcomed Secretary (SE&L), Secretary (HE), other PAB members and the participating representatives of various universities/institutes attending the meeting. Secretary (SE&L) and Secretary (HE)

asked JS (P) to start the proceedings. JS(P) made a brief presentation giving an overview of the current status; objectives, components and thrust of the scheme; Component –wise details of Schools of Education (SoEs), Centres of Excellence in Science and Mathematics(CESMEs), Teaching Learning Centres(TLCs), Faculty Development Centres(FDC),Inter-University Centres for Teacher Education(IUCTE), National Resource Centre for Education(NRC)/higher education academy, Centres of Academic Leadership and Education Management(CALEM), Innovations, awards and teaching resource grant, including workshops and seminars, Subject based Networks (SBN)for curricular renewal and reforms; Sustainability dimension after scheme completion, Group of Secretaries (GoS) recommendations regarding leadership development and induction training of faculty in the context of PMMMMNMTT, Monitoring & evaluation and the decision of recent EFC meeting.

Secretary (SE&L) observed that for monitoring only digital and electronic datasets must be monitored and checked. All institutions will upload their training calendars, photos and videos of activities undertaken. Random visits may be done as a follow up exercise. JS (P) clarified that the PMMMMNMTT portal was being developed and is expected to be functional by January 2018.

4. The Minutes of the Ninth PAB meeting held on 12th July, 2017 were read and confirmed.

5. Thereafter, the proposals were examined and proposing institutions were invited to present the proposals submitted. A total of 23 proposals from 22 institutions were being considered in this PAB meeting as shown at **Annexure II**. Osmania University was not represented in the meeting.

7. The Tenth PAB Meeting considered the following proposals and their observation /comments are as given below:

8. Further, all institutions have been advised to have a sustainability plan so that these activities can be continued after March 2020 by the Institute. For this, a culture of levying charges may gradually be introduced and other sources of funding also may be explored. Based on the decision of the PAB, the approved budget of the approved institutions is as shown at **Annexure III**.

8.1 Secretary (HE) emphasized that SoEs must focus on the mandate of offering integrated pre-service teacher programmes at UG & PG levels. He also desired that more proposals of this nature be mobilized.

8.2 The proposals for setting up SoEs require NCTE approval for offering pre-service teacher education programmes and also UGC clearances for sanction of teaching positions. Many of the institutions expressed that there are delays and difficulties in getting NCTE/UGC clearances/approvals. Secretary (HE) and Secretary (SE&L) advised the representatives of NCTE & UGC present in the meeting to ensure expeditious clearances.

9. The Agenda Item regarding Implementation of GoS recommendations for Mandatory Induction Training programmes of newly recruited faculty in higher education and Academic Leadership Development programme for senior academic and administrative functionaries (VC/Registrar/Dean/Heads) of higher/secondary education institutions was discussed. Based on budget estimates submitted by the implementing institutions, an approximate cost estimation has been worked out for conduct of these programmes.

- i) For one month residential Mandatory Induction Training of 40 faculty, the cost works out to approx. Rs.20.20 Lakhs. 30 Centres of PMMMNMTT conducting 3 rounds of Induction Training would work out to Rs. 18.18 crore
- ii) For one month residential Mandatory Induction Training of 40 faculties, the cost works out to approx. Rs.20.20 Lakhs. 10 UGC- HRDCs conducting 3 rounds of Induction Training would work out to Rs. 6.06 crore
- iii) Academic Leadership Development programme covering 35 participants the cost estimation has been worked out to approx.Rs.19 lakh each for 6 days and 4 days program. Each centre cost would be Rs. 0.38 lakhs. 10 centres, under PMMMNMTT conducting 3 rounds of Academic Leadership Development would work out to Rs. 11.40 crore.

Appreciating the importance of GoS recommendations, the PAB has given approval and agreed for releasing funds amounting to Rs. 35.56 crore in the current financial year, subject to the approval from competent authority. Also, JS&FA has advised that from the approved outlays till March 2020, funds from the savings of other components may be earmarked for future budgetary allocations. It was also agreed that the travelling allowance of all participants both teachers and academic/administrative leaders for induction training and leadership development will be provided under this budget.

10. Agenda Item relating to Equivalence of UGC Career Advancement Scheme for orientation /refresher /API scores was discussed. Secretary (SE&L) and Secretary (HE) has agreed with the importance of this issue to ensure the motivation amongst the teachers to get quality training and asked JS(P) to pursue with UGC to ensure this. Two separate letters are being sent to UGC. One is regarding mandatory Induction Training program for inclusion under Seventh Pay Review Committee for university and college

teachers. Another letter is for equivalence of training programmes under PMMMMNMTT for orientation and refresher courses as well as for API scores for promotion.

11. It was informed to the PAB that all approved institutions have on boarded on PFMS portal and will implement EAT module.

12. An update on EFC for continuation of scheme till March 2020 was informed to the PAB with its decision. Schools of Education can be set up in State Universities, on CSS funding pattern shared between States and Centres in a ratio of 60:40 (Other States)/90:10(NER)/100:0(UTs) as applicable currently to CSS. The funding for GoS recommendations will be met from the PMMMMNMTT funds and greater thrust may be given to the identified activities.

The meeting concluded with a vote of Thanks to the Chairs.
