

Minutes of the second meeting of Central GIAC for Infrastructure Development of Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (IDMI) held on 3rd August, 2012

The second meeting of the Central Grant-in-Aid Committee (GIAC) for Infrastructure Development of Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (IDMI) for the year 2012-13 was held 3rd August, 2012 in the Conference Room, C-Wing, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Anshu Vaish, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy. A list of participants is attached at **Annexure-I**. Shri Virender Singh, Deputy Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy welcomed the participants and presented the agenda for discussion and consideration of the Central GIAC.

Agenda 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on 15th June, 2012.

The minutes of the Central GIAC meeting held on 15th June, 2012 were confirmed by the Committee, as no objection was received.

Agenda 2: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the minutes of the meeting held on 15th June, 2012.

The Action Taken Report was noted by the Committee.

Agenda- 3: Budget provision for 2012-13 under Infrastructure Development of Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (IDMI)

The Committee noted the budget provision for IDMI for the financial year 2012-13 is as under:

The Committee was informed that out of the allocated budget of Rs. 5000 lakh, an amount of Rs. 262 lakh has been released to Sikkim, Mizoram and Kerala till date. Proposals amounting to Rs. 1198.58 lakhs were approved in the meeting of the CGIAC held on 15.06.2012 and release of funds is under process. **A sum of Rs. 3539.62 lakh is the balance available.**

Agenda 4: Proposals for consideration of Central GIAC

Proposals received from Kerala (51), Mizoram (5) and Tripura (104) were placed before the Central GIAC Committee for consideration and approval. The Committee examined all proposals in detail and decided as follows:

- (i) **KERALA:** The Central GIAC examined all 51 proposals received from Govt. of Kerala, in detail. Each and every proposal was examined with reference to infrastructure already available with the Institute, enrolment of students and rational requirement of infrastructure of the Institutes. Representative of the State Government informed that the proposals submitted to MHRD were examined by the State Grant in Aid Committee and it was ensured that the institutions proposed for grant fulfills all eligibility conditions. While examining the proposals he also gave preference and recommendation for the institutions and the component of infrastructure to be considered for approval.

While examining the proposals the Committee noted that, many of the institutes proposed for grant have sufficient infrastructure in place and therefore approved only that component of infrastructure which was justified based on the enrollment of students. The Committees decided that the costing of the infrastructure proposals should be reworked based on items approved by the Committee.

Accordingly, average cost proposed by the institutes for a particular component has been taken as the unit cost for that particular component. In some cases (Sr. Nos. 10, 12, 13, 15, 17, 18 and 20 in the table below) break up was not available for different components such as Additional Classrooms (ACRs) and toilets for girls & boy. In such cases unit cost approved under SSA during 2012-13, which are based on the State Schedule of Rates (SoR) duly notified by the State Government of Kerala, have been used for that particular component. Further in cases where the unit cost proposed, were very high, the same has been restricted to the unit cost approved under SSA for Kerala during 2012-13. These cases (in table below) are: a) Sl No. 1 for girls and boys toilets, Sl. No. 2 unit cost for ACR, Library and lab, Sl. No 4 unit cost for library and lab, Sl. No 8 in respect of boys and girls toilets, Sl No. 11 for boys toilets and Sl. No 14 for boys and girls toilets.

Based on the above criteria the details of approvals accorded by the Central GIAC are as under:-

(iii) **TRIPURA:**

The Committee examined 154 proposals received from Tripura in respect of various Madrasas. It was noted that all Madrasas proposed for grant under IDMI have in the past received grant from Ministry of Human Resource Development under the Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasas (SPQEM) scheme. The details relating to the proposals were also not furnished. Moreover no representative from the State Government attended the meeting. The Committee therefore did not take up the proposals received from Govt. of Tripura. The Committee advised the Department to write to the state Government on the above mentioned issues.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
