As you are aware, the Secondary Education Management and Information System (SEMIS) is of critical importance to planning and identification of existing shortfall in secondary education. The importance of preparing the annual plan for 2011-12 on proper analysis of SEMIS has been underscored in the guidelines issued by the Ministry.

2. The annual plan proposals for 2011-12 should ideally be based on SEMIS 2010-11 (as on 30.09.2010). However, it is observed that your State has not yet been able to complete data entry for SEMIS 2008-09 and 2009-10. As per the guidelines issued by the NUEPA, data entry for SEMIS 2010-11 cannot be taken up unless data for 2009-10 has been frozen by the State Government. Considering the status of data entry for SEMIS, the Ministry has extended the deadline to submit annual plan proposals for 2011-12 by one month, upto 31.03.2011. No further extension will be provided. It is absolutely imperative for the State governments to complete data entry for SEMIS for both 2009-10 and 2010-11 at the earliest so that annual plan proposal can be submitted in time. Since there has been delay in data collection and entry in case of 2010-11, it has been decided that those States which are unable to use 2010-11 data for preparation of Annual Plan of 2011-12, can make use of SEMIS data for the year 2009-10.

3. I shall therefore be thankful for your personal intervention to ensure that SEMIS data for 2009-10 and 2010-11 in your State/UT are frozen immediately.



Considering the status of data entry for SEMIS, the Ministry has extended the deadline to submit annual plan proposals for 2011-12 by one month, upto 31.03.2011. No further extension will be provided. It is absolutely imperative for the State governments to complete data entry for SEMIS 2010-11 at the earliest so that annual plan proposal can be submitted in time.

3. I shall therefore be thankful for your personal intervention to ensure that SEMIS data for 2010-11 in your State/UT are frozen immediately. However, in case of difficulty, your State is permitted to use 2009-10 SEMIS data for preparation of Annual Plan for 2011-12.
