The fourth meeting of the Central Grant-in-Aid Committee (GIAC) for the year 2014-15 for considering proposals under the Scheme for Infrastructure Development of Private Aided/ Unaided Minority Institutes (Elementary Secondary/ Senior Secondary Schools) (IDMI) and Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madarsas (SPQEM) was held on 10.03.2015 at 4.00 p.m. under the Chairpersonship of Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy.Dr. Meenakshi Jolly (Director), Department of School Education&Literacy, welcomed the participants and presented the agenda for discussion and consideration for the Central GIAC.

Agenda 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on 22nd December, 2014.

The committeeconfirmed, the minutes of the meeting held on 22ndDecember, 2014and no objection was received from any quarter.

Agenda 2: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the minutes of the meeting held on 22ndDecember, 2014 and Budget Provision.

Action Taken Report was noted by the Committee. The Committee noted that theBudget Provision for the SPQEM and IDMI for the financial year 2014-15 is Rs. 37500.00 lakh including Rs. 3750.00 lakh for NER. It was informed that out this an amount of Rs. 8585.32 lakhs has been released to the State Govt. under SPQEM and an amount of Rs. 1138.42 lakhs has been released under IDMI and further an amount of Rs. 2199.24 lakhs is being released under SPQEM. Therefore, Rs. 9724 .74 lakhs has been released and Rs. 2199.24 lakhs is being released totaling Rs. 11923.98 lakhs.

Agenda 3:Proposals for consideration of Central GIAC under SPQEM

The Committee was informed that the department has received renewal and fresh proposals from the States of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh and Kerala. The Committee took the renewal proposals first for consideration:

It was also requested by the Committee to provide certification details. The NIOS requested for reimbursement as per the revised rates provided to the Department. The Committee observed that since the proposal has been submitted as per the old rates,

Agenda 5: Infrastructure Development Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (Elementary Secondary/ Senior Secondary Schools) (IDMI):

The Committee was informed that proposals have been received from the Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh, West Bengal, Manipur, Nagaland, Sikkim and Kerala.

(1) ARUNACHAL PRADESH

The Committee examined two proposals received from the Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh for consideration under IDMI. The State Govt. representative informed the Committee that the institutions seeking grants were in very far-flung areas and because of their geographical location there are severe constraints regarding access to the institutions. Therefore, there was an extreme need for the hostels for these institutions. The Committee directed the State representative to give directions to the institutions to deposit 25% share in their account first, and then their proposal would be considered by the Central GIAC.

(2) WEST BENGAL

The Central GIAC examined the proposal from West Bengal however it was observed that all the institutions proposed for infrastructure were madarsas which are not schools affiliated with the State Govt. or Central Board of Secondary Education. The State representative informed that in West Bengal madarsas are affiliated to State madarsas board. Therefore, the Committee decided that a legal opinion is to be obtained regarding this before any decision in the matter is taken.

(3) MANIPUR

The Govt. of Manipur had forwarded one proposal under IDMI. However, since there was no representative from the State Govt. of Manipur, the agenda item was deferred by the CGIA Committee.

(4) NAGALAND

The Govt. of Manipur had forwarded one proposal under IDMI. However, since there was no representative from the State Govt. of Manipur, the agenda item was deferred by the CGIA Committee.

(5) SIKKIM

The Committee was informed that 8 proposals had been received from the Govt. of Sikkim, the representative of State Govt. of Sikkim requested for a multipurpose auditorium in a few proposals, which was not allowed. The Committee approved the following proposals.
